

Date: August 3, 2004

President Miller called the meeting to order at 1934 Hrs. EDST.

The meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance, then a moment of silence was observed for Silent Keys. There were a total of 20 members and 2 guests in attendance. The following Board Members were present at the meeting: President Miller, Treasurer Ryan, Secretary Wolfe, Board Member Gable, Board Member James Kelly, and Board Member Larry Miller.

Corrections Additions to the minutes: There were no corrections or additions to the minutes of the July meeting. Treasurer's Report (Paul - NOKIA)

Paul reported the ending balance for July was \$725.02.

Committee Reports:

Repeater

Jeff N3MFT reports that the county has approved adding voting to the 94 machine and is waiting for the bid for the installation contract. Rod N3XG reported that 135 is up and running, and other than some down-time due to what is believed to have been malicious jamming, there are no other problems at this time.

Program

Phil KB3HMK reports that this month the topic is Echo Link by Bob N3QZR, and next month Phil will be presenting Geocaching.

Volunteer Examiners

Mark AK3M reported that the VE team tested 2 in July. Lou KF2WO tested for Extra Class and has upgraded, Lou is also currently awaiting the official notice from the FCC to indicate his call sign change from KF2WO to N3OL. Additionally, Ken Maskall passed his entry-level technician test and is now licensed as KB3LJE. Congratulations to both Lou and Ken. Field Day

Lou KF2WO has submitted the final paperwork to the ARRL.

Web Site

Web site is up and running. A new member / first time guest, Jeff WD3V, reported to the club that he used the web site to find us and join.

Education

Rod N3XG reports that he was in contact with two of the three instructors for the entry Technician class. He will be running the fall weekend class on October 15, 16, and 17. Rod made a request for any member that wishes to help with the class, either in a support role or as an instructor to contact him.

OLD Business

- 1. Rod N3XG was able to meet with past President Check and retrieve some archived recorded from the club, to include the original certificate of organization issued by the County of Lehigh. The records are now in the hands of Paul N0KIA. Rod also received 3 mobile radios that Dennis had been collecting for club use. Rod will attempt to make a temporary repeater out of the 2 Syntor X mobiles. Rod will update the club on the success of the experiment.
- 2. President Miller reminded club members that this weekend (August 7) the club is hosting a fishing trip.
- 3. Rod N3XG reported that he has the reserve receive element for 135 and the new FM transmit element is in production.
- 4. Lou KF2WO reported that he has found that the supplier Davis RF will give us the best price on RG-8x. Lou states that he can purchase 300 foot of the coaxial cable and 6 PL-259's and 6 UG176 reducers, with delivery for \$56.34. The club approved the purchase.

New Business

- 1. President Miller is taking nominations for the Pres Schuler award. President Miller explained that the Pres Schuler Award should be presented to the club member that has made the biggest contribution to the club and to the Amateur Radio Service. The award is presented at the December meeting, so nominations for the award close in November.
- 2. The Club has been approached by the National Weather Service to use one of our repeaters for the Sky-Warn Wide Area BEARS link system. NWS will pay for the link radio, tower work, antenna and all equipment needed for the link. After some discussion the membership agreed that this is a win-win situation for the club and it will bring back some use to the repeater. We look forward to this capability. President Miller will draft a letter of agreement to the NWS giving the permission to start the program.
- 3. President Miller announced an EMCOM seminar on October 23, in Selinsgrove PA. Jeff N3MFT is asking for any photos of amateur operators at work during activations for the seminar. Jeff would forward the photos to Eric WB3FPL for use in a presentation at the EMCOM seminar.
- 4. President Miller announced a pizza night to be held prior to the meeting on September 7. The pizza will be served around 7 pm.
- 5. President Miller reminded club members that nominations for 2005 officers would be held in November. President Miller also announced that he will not seek re-elections and will decline any nomination for the office of President
- 6. Jeff N3MFT reported that the County of Lehigh has purchased a new 80-meter vertical antenna for the communications vehicle. They have also purchased a new satellite uplink system. Jeff hopes to bring the vehicle for membership familiarization to October's meeting, providing the new items have been installed.
- 7. Erik AI3D, a past club member, has donated two spools of 12 gauge wire. Erik will be leaving the area to pursue graduate school and has expressed interest in running some SKEDs. We wish Erik continued success and thank him for the donation.

The membership of W3OI was presented with new membership applications from the following amateurs: Fran Carey KB3HZB, Robert House WB3JSZ, Jack Seeger KC9DQV, and Jeff Spirko WD3V. A motion was made by Robin KB3GZV to accept the applicants as new members. Jeff N3MFT provided a second to the motion. President Miller called for a vote; and all present were in favor.

A motion to close the meeting was made by Jim KA3UQP and Mark N3ULR provided a second. All present were in favor and the motion to close carried.

Actor Marlon Brando (Martin


Brandeaux), KE6PZH / FO5GJ, SK





HAMS MUSTER IN WAKE OF FLORIDA CAPITAL BLACKOUT


Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES) teams and local amateurs in the Tallahassee, Florida, area volunteered to assist after electrical power went out in about half of the capital city July 13. The region was affected for about three hours before power was restored. More than a dozen amateurs participated in the blackout response.

"We have a very active ARES group here in the Capital District, and all the local hams as usual responded immediately," said Gadsden County Emergency Coordinator Bill Mapoles, KG4LFT. At the request of local authorities, hams helped during the blackout by reporting traffic difficulties, non-operating traffic signals and other power failure-related problems, he said. The 2 PM blackout during hot, humid weather, killed air conditioning, snarled traffic and led Florida A&M University to close for the rest of the afternoon.

Former Capital District EC Kent Hutchinson, KC4TOC, started up an informal Tallahassee blackout net, subsequently picked up by Paul Eakins, KJ4G. Amateurs staffed the local emergency operations center and also assisted the American Red Cross, which opened a shelter and three aid stations.

"I'm proud to be a part of our local ARES group," Mapoles said, "and I can say that we, in the Capital District, are prepared for anything."



LIGHTNING MYTHS & TRUTHS

MYTH: If it is not raining, then there is no danger of lightning.

TRUTH: Lightning often strikes outside of heavy rain and may occur as far as 10 miles away from any rainfall.

MYTH: The rubber soles of shoes or rubber tires on a car will protect you from being struck by lightning. TRUTH: Rubber soled shoes and rubber tires provide NO protection from lightning. The steel frame of a hard topped vehicle provides increased protection if you are not touching metal. Although you may be injured if lightning strikes your car, you are much safer inside a vehicle than outside.

MYTH: People struck by lightning carry a charge and should not be touched.

TRUTH: Lightning strike victims carry no electrical charge and should be attended to immediately.

MYTH: "Heat lightning" occurs after very hot summer day and poses no threat.

TRUTH: "Heat lightning" is a term used to describe lightning from a thunderstorm too far away to be heard.

Amateur Radio Facilitates Dramatic Rescue at Sea

Radio operators in the US, French Polynesia and Australia played an vital role in the successful late-June rescue of a couple aboard a privately owned sailboat in the Pacific Ocean. The drama began July 25 after John Caine, VK4CEJ, in Queensland, Australia, checked into the Pacific Seafarers Net on 14.313 MHz with emergency traffic from the 47-foot sailing ketch *Fingolfin*, some 680 nautical miles north of Nuka Hiva--the largest of the Marquesas Islands in French Polynesia. A young Australian couple, John and Kelly Hallows, were on their way from Mexico to the Marquesas.

With the trip taking longer than anticipated, John Hallows had run out of a required medication and was experiencing debilitating pain.

Through Maritime Mobile Service Net (MMSN) member Bob Botik, K5SIV, in Austin, Texas, the US Coast Guard in Honolulu and a shipping firm, arrangements were made for the Greek container vessel *Irene Logos* to rendezvous with the *Fingolfin* and transfer the needed medication. Unfortunately, the larger vessel struck the ketch during the transfer, badly damaging it. To add insult to injury, the medication transferred turned out to be the wrong one. Eventually other Amateur Radio operators became part of the unfolding drama, and Botik found himself as a key player.


