






Brain Teaser

Larry, who is a meteorologist at the National Weather Service office in Mount Holly, NJ, will be the instructor for the training session. In addition to Larry, we will have Ed Hanna, Chief Meteorologist, from WFMZ-TV 69News/AccuWeather Channel, who will be providing the added dimension of local flavor to the training session.

The session will last approximately 2 to 3 hours including a mid-point break. April is the time to prepare for the storms that will arrive in the spring and summer. Skywarn information is key information for the national weather service and is provided by volunteers like you. If you have attended a prior class, now would be the time for a refresher. Skywarn classes are not presented often, so take advantage of this opportunity. Everyone who attends will be eligible for certification as a National Weather Service Skywarn Spotter.
