The United States flag today. The 50th star was added on July 4, 1960 for Hawaii, which entered the Union on August 21, 1959.

The flag of the United States of America today has 13 stripes - 7 red and 6 white - and 50 white stars on a blue field - five rows of 6 and four rows of 5. The stripes remind us of the 13 original colonies that gained us our liberty. The stars represent the states that are bound together into one country.

LVARC AUCTION A BIG SUCCESS










The LVARC Auction was a HUGE success! The auction was held on June 7, 2005 prior to the LVARC regular business meeting.



Lightning - Revisited

Do you know the best way to be safe in a lightning storm? Not your equipment, but you personally. The following guidelines are offered. You may have seen them before, but a review is always prudent.



AT HOME:

- **DO** make sure animals are under shelter if hail is predicted.
- **DO** unplug televisions and computers before a storm hits, but *never* touch cords or cables when lightning is in the area.
- **DO** find the safest place to wait out the storm, usually the basement or a room without windows.
- DO use the "30-30 Rule." When you see lightning, count the seconds until you hear thunder. If it is 30 seconds or less, the thunderstorm is close enough to be dangerous. After the last thunderclap, wait 30 minutes or more before leaving shelter.
- **DON'T** take a bath, Stay away from plumbing fixtures. Metal pipes can transmit electricity.
- **DON'T** handle telephones or electrical devices during a storm: lightning can follow the wires.

IN A VEHICLE:

- **DO** pull off the road, turn off your engine and stay in your car. Turn on your emergency flashers.
- **DON'T** park under trees or in low-lying areas prone to flooding.
- **DON'T** touch metal objects such as door handles, radio controls or the steering wheel.

IF TRAPPED OUTDOORS:

- **DO** crouch down and lean forward, with your hands on your knees to make yourself as small as possible while minimizing contact with the ground.
- **DON'T** seek shelter under anything tall, such as a tree, it's a likely target for lightning.
- **DON'T** lie flat on the ground. Currents can travel across the surface.



ARRL SIGNING MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH CIVIL AIR PATROL

The Civil Air Patrol (CAP) and ARRL will sign a Memorandum of Agreement during Dayton Hamvention, May 20-22, where CAP plans to field a major presence. The agreement will spell out guidelines for CAP--the US Air Force Auxiliary, and ARRL--the national association for Amateur Radio, to better use and integrate their resources during communication exercises and emergencies.

"Civil Air Patrol has one of the largest unified communications networks in the nation," said CAP Lt Col Maurice Thomas, N3ADV. "Federal, state and local agencies call on CAP members every day for communication support in search-and-rescue missions and disaster relief." Thomas says CAP, which has been in existence for more than 60 years, needs "implementers" for its communication technology.


