
Amateur Radio Remains "Only Viable Means" of Communication in Some Areas (Oct. 3, 2005) -- In the wake of hurricanes Katrina and Rita, the need continues for both Amateur Radio communication and for volunteer operators. South Texas ARRL Section Emergency Coordinator Jerry Reimer, KK5CA, reported over the weekend that all 35,000 residents of Jasper County are among more than 175,000 Texans without electric power more than a week after Rita struck. Without electricity, he says, Amateur Radio repeaters are only usable when connected to an on-site generator and regularly refueled--something he called "a daunting task" with fuel both in short supply and expensive. 

he said, but Lehigh County has backups to backups, including amateur radio operators " (section B, page 7).






Operation Ho Ho Press Release

"The governors of Mississippi, Louisiana, Alabama and Texas are reemphasizing their plea that volunteers should not self dispatch themselves to the hurricane impacted areas. Individuals arriving by themselves without a sanctioned mission are becoming an additional burden. Identified emergency services staff shortages which includes medical, rescue, law enforcement, emergency management and others are being coordinated through the EMAC process from states not impacted by the hurricanes."

Amateur Radio Continues Hurricane Rita Response

NEWINGTON, CT, Sep. 26, 2006--Amateur Radio volunteers have been utilizing a variety of modes, including HF, VHF-UHF *Winlink* and VoIP, to pass critical Hurricane Rita-related traffic. HF net frequencies remain busy with traffic related to the emergency. The West Gulf ARES Emergency Net continues 24-hour operation on 7.285 MHz days/3.873 MHz evenings, with health-and-welfare traffic taking place on 7.290 MHz days/3.935 MHz evenings. The Salvation Army Team Emergency Net (SATERN) has been activating at 1400 UTC daily on 14.265 MHz and monitoring for emergency requests. All amateurs are requested to keep these HF net frequencies clear for Hurricane Rita emergency operations.



PPL Decides Against Entering Broadband Market

PPL has decided not to enter the market as a broadband Internet provider over its power lines following a trial in some Lehigh Valley markets, the company reported on its Web site Monday.

The company will end the market trial for residential customers on Oct. 31. Locations affected by the decision include Emmaus, Whitehall, Upper Macungie, Hanover Township and north Bethlehem.

PPL said it will fulfill its contractual commitments with institutional customers in south Bethlehem and center city Allentown.

"While our market trials indicate that BPL technology is promising, the combination of a competitive marketplace and the need for significant scale has led us to the decision not to proceed as a retail communications service provider," said David Kelley, president – PPL Telcom in a press release.

PPL has notified residential market trial customers in those areas of its decision. The company will give those customers a \$50 credit to ease the transition to another Internet service provider.

The ending of the trial does not result in any material financial accounting impacts on PPL.
