Elimination of the CW Requirement Demystified - de Mark (AK3M)

As we all have heard, the Morse Code Requirement ended Friday, February 23, 2007! Following, is the bottom line.

If you have a Technician license:

1. You can now upgrade **WITHOUT** the Element 1 (CW). You <u>MUST</u> have a valid CSCE. A CSCE is valid if dated within 365 days from the date you test.

ALL upgrades MUST be done via a VE Test session. That means, you will need to present to the VE team:

- 1. 2 forms of ID
- 2. \$14.00 (EXACT CASH)
- 3. Your valid CSCE
- 4. A **COPY** of your license which must accompany your NCVEC 605.

You will be required to complete a NCVEC 605. Your paperwork will be processed like any other paperwork to the ARRL.

Remember, your upgrade from Technician is <u>NOT</u> automatic. You must upgrade at a certified ARRL VE test session.
