Valentine's Day History



There are varying opinions as to the origin of **Valentine's Day**. Some experts state that it originated from St. Valentine, a Roman who was martyred for refusing to give up Christianity. He died on February 14, 269 A.D., the same day that had been devoted to love lotteries. Legend also says that **St. Valentine** left a farewell note for the jailer's daughter, who had become his friend, and signed it "From Your Valentine". Other aspects of the story say that **Saint Valentine** served as a priest at the temple during the reign of Emperor Claudius. Claudius then had Valentine jailed for defying him. In 496 A.D. Pope Gelasius set aside February 14 to honour St. Valentine.

Gradually, February 14 became the date for exchanging love messages and St. Valentine became the **patron saint of lovers**. The date was marked by sending poems and simple gifts such as flowers. There was often a social gathering or a ball

FCC to Drop Morse Code Testing for All License Classes

The FCC will modify the Amateur Radio Service rules, eliminating Morse code exam requirements.

The rule changes will grant limited HF operating privileges to Technician licensees on 80, 40, 15, and 10 meters. This is also a great opportunity to encourage Technician licensees to upgrade. Once the new rules take effect, Technicians can upgrade to General by passing the Element 3 written exam and to Amateur Extra by also passing the Element 4 written exam. No Morse code test will be required.

The best estimate of when the Morse code requirement will go away officially is sometime in February -- 30 days after the R&O appears in the Federal Register.

The LVARC Offers Incentive for Element 1 (CW) Test

The last person to successfully pass the Morse Code (Element 1) exam at a W3OI sponsored test session will be awarded a gift certificate to HRO.

Rules are as follows:

- (1) The person must pass Element 1 (CW) before the FCC no longer requires HF operators to do so.
- (2) The ham must be a current member of LVARC at least one week prior to the test date
- (3) He/she may **not** hold a license above Technician, nor have previous Element 1 credit.

Thanks to a generous donation from No-Code International, the current amount is \$100.00 USD. If more than one club member successfully passes Element 1 at the same VE session, the award will be split between the candidates.

FCC cites Pennsylvania radio amateur for failure to ID (Jan 3, 2007) -- The FCC's Philadelphia Field Office has issued a formal Notice of Violation (NoV) to a Pennsylvania radio amateur for failure to identify in a timely manner. The Commission released the NoV to Andrew Ban, KB3GRK, of Feasterville, on December 20. The notice says that on September 12 and 13, 2006, an agent of the FCC's Philadelphia office monitored KB3GRK's transmissions on 439.850 MHz and observed that the operator failed to identify for nearly one hour in one instance and for more than 20 minutes in the second. §97.119(a) of the Amateur Radio Service rules requires stations to identify "at the end of each communication, and at least every 10 minutes during a communication." has advised Ban that he must submit within 20 days a written statement addressing the alleged violations and action taken to preclude recurrence. The issuance of an NoV appears to be a departure from the FCC Enforcement Bureau's typical practice of addressing such alleged infractions with an advisory letter rather than a formal notice.
