Plenty to blame for I-78 debacle



PennDOT didn't hire more snowplow drivers -- PEMA repeated problems from 2006 flooding -- State police chief notified late of backup

State officials, including Gov. Ed Rendell, knew about problems with Pennsylvania's emergency response system at least five months before the Valentine's Day storm that stranded motorists for miles, but failed to take corrective action, according to an independent report released Tuesday.

Poor communication among state agencies and a lack of understanding of the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency's role during disasters were obvious after June 2006 floods. But the state did not change procedures.

The state's delayed response to the Valentine's Day storm that snarled traffic and closed parts of Interstates 78, 80 and 81 for hours was the result of a systemic failure of Pennsylvania's emergency response agencies, the investigation by James Lee Witt Associates found.

"Given the gaps in the system, something like this was bound to happen," Rendell acknowledged as he called for a long list of changes -- but no firings.

"Am I totally satisfied that we can respond to a terrorist attack or natural disaster? No," Rendell told reporters.

The system's Feb. 14 failures occurred at every level of local, county and state agencies including PennDOT, state police and PEMA, and ranged from not having enough people to run snowplows in Berks County to even senior officials being unaware of basic state emergency policies.

The \$130,000 report found no formal plans on how to divert traffic on state highways or even agreement on when a road officially is closed. Fifty-five of the state's 74 Roadway Weather Information System sensors weren't working, and the highway advisory radio in District 5, which covers Berks, Carbon, Lehigh, Monroe, Northampton and Schuylkill counties, was inoperable.

The report found "PennDOT did not fully understand how to work alongside PEMA in an emergency, nor did PEMA explain its expectations of PennDOT during an emergency."

In disasters, emergency response "problems that are below the radar? surface," said Witt, a former director of the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

In Berks County, those problems included a number of retirements in January, leaving an inexperienced PennDOT crew and a shortage of workers. Berks only had enough workers for one 12-hour shift of snow removal, the report found.

Local PennDOT officials should have known they had the ability to hire more drivers for the storm or contract out snow removal, Rendell said, but they failed to do so.

Witt's investigation did not include an equipment inventory or review PennDOT's budget, but Rendell and Administration Secretary Joe Martz said there was not a lack of vehicles.

In District 4, which includes Luzerne County, where I-80 and I-81 meet, the problem was simply too much traffic as vehicles were diverted from I-78 onto I-80 and I-81, Martz said. "You just basically poured gasoline on a fire," he said.

At the state level, problems included a complex array of **communication** and supervisory **problems**. There was inadequate interagency planning before the storm. Rendell and state police Commissioner Jeffrey Miller weren't made aware of the traffic problems until late in the day, and then not from the chain of command.

Additionally, available information wasn't communicated up the line.

PennDOT's road condition reporting systems weren't available to PennDOT staff at PEMA's State Emergency Operations Center.

County emergency workers didn't notify PEMA of the traffic problems, and PEMA didn't raise the activation level of the operations center until nearly 14 hours after problems began.

If the level had been raised, each department would have sent an employee to the command center, ensuring information sharing and "a lot of what occurred could have been avoided," Rendell said.

But the communication problems among the agencies weren't new. [RACES not included -- ed.]

IMPORTANT

Do not follow instructions in bogus "arrl.net user support team" e-mails



(Mar 30, 2007) -- The ARRL is alerting members -- and especially users of the ARRL E-Mail Forwarding Service -- about bogus e-mails that claim to be from the "arrl.net user support team."

There is no such entity, and the messages do not originate with ARRL but appear to be coming from outside the US. Recipients should not follow the instructions in the e-mail, which reads, "We have received reports that your e-mail account has been used to send a large amount of unsolicited commercial email messages during this week. We suspect that your computer had been infected by a recent virus and now contains a hidden proxy server. We recommend you to follow our instructions in order to keep your computer safe."

Following the instructions will have the opposite effect, however, infecting your computer with the MyDoom Trojan worm and making it part of a spamming network. The League urges all members to invest in and use anti-virus software.
