

The second reading of the by-laws change was read tonight. It is as follows:

Current version:

ARTICLE I - Membership

Section 1. - Qualifications

- C. To be an active member one must hold an amateur license and is a current member.
- D. To be an associate member, it is not necessary to hold an amateur license.

Proposed change:

C. To be an associate member, one must be current of dues and have been voted into the club by majority vote at time of membership application. Associate members need not hold an amateur license.

D. To be an active member, one must be current of dues and have been voted into the active membership by majority vote after attending no less than two club meetings within any 12-month period after acceptance as an associate member. Active members must hold a valid amateur license issued by the FCC.

A motion will be asked under new business. Rod received a quote for a new repeater. This will replace the existing 147.135 repeater. The repeater will suit the clubs needs.

Spring! A wonderful time of year! The weather becomes more tolerable and hams begin to think of those long awaited outdoor antenna projects, Field Day is not far off and once again, public service events creep into the Spring, Summer and Fall calendars.

Oh, oh, there goes Mark again with his pitch for volunteers for radio communication support for community service activities. You are correct but don't stop reading yet. In the course of one year, the LVARC provides communications support for **only four** events (excluding Operation Ho Ho). Those include, (1) the LVRR 1/2 marathon [April], (2) St. Joseph The Worker 5K [May], (3) the LV Marathon [September] and (4) the Women's 5K for Breast Cancer [October].

We should be proud that these organizations recognize our capabilities and our ability to help. We should be pleased that they are satisfied with our services. We should feel honored that we are needed year after year. Let's face it, we DO have an unusual hobby with unique skills and we offer our services all at one great price ---FREE!!!!



(d) The final episode of MASH

Marine Communications, In Brief

Did you know that marine VHF communications are allowed from **boat to boat only**, with the exception of a boat's communication with the USCG (land station) or bridge (draw bridge) control operator? (Source: USCG Aux. Radio Officers).



That means it is <u>NOT</u> permitted to use marine VHF communications from a land station to a boat and visa versa. You cannot talk to a friend while he is on his boat and you are on land (in a house, parking lot, picnic area etc.).

By the way, current VHF radio communications will be fading out as a new digital system will be introduced along the East and Northwest coasts and the Gulf of Mexico/Florida's West coast area.

The **new system**, called **Rescue 21**, will be the nation's primary maritime emergency system for the more than 78 million boaters and 13 million vessels that navigate coastal and intercoastal waters.

The system will greatly improve the Coast Guard's ability to detect mayday calls from boaters, pinpoint the location of the source of the call, and coordinate rescue operations throughout the 95,000 mile U.S. coastline and interior waterways.
