

Another Successful ARES Activity

de Mark (AK3M)

On a very chilly overcast April 27, 2008, twelve LVARC members were on site at their stations for the Lehigh Valley Road Runners' 1/2 Marathon. The event included a 5k run which began at 8:00 am followed by the start of the 1/2 marathon (13 miles) at 8:10 am. About 3,500 runners participated in both runs. The "LVARC ARES Team," was posted around both routes which approximated one operator at every water stop and at each medical tent.

Two emergency situations were reported to and handled by Net Control Station (at the ASD stadium) who then alerted Allentown paramedic units who were in radio communications with their field units. One fisherman in the Parkway had a fish hook embedded in his hand and the second incident was a call for a "Runner Down." A young lady collapsed and was nauseous and disoriented. It was later learned that because of our communications, the medical response team was on the scene of the downed runner in a little more than *one minute*!

The following LVARC operators volunteered and were present for the event. TNX to Mark (AK3M), Larry (NR3R), Mike (KB3LOD), Charlie (KB3FDM), John (KB3PJO), Brian (KB3QHA), Jeff (KB3OCP), Fran (KB3HZB), Jeff (N3MFT), Bob (WB3JSZ), Ike (N3IK) and Larsen (KB3QLG). Simulated Receipt Time: 2330 UTC, June 23, 2008

To: All Lehigh County Radio Amateurs

The US, from the Mississippi river east, has been experiencing frequent brown outs and black outs due to the extended duration of the unseasonably severe hot and humid weather. The power grid is currently stressed to the breaking point. While terrorist activity has been discounted, it cannot be completely ruled out.

The local EMA office has asked radio amateurs to plan for a possible situation where they could provide both local VHF/UHF coverage within the valley as well as long haul communications to areas outside the affected zone. They would like the site to be "local" (i.e. within a few miles of downtown). The LVARC, as a member of Lehigh County RACES, is looking at locations within five miles of center city Allentown to support this requirement. We would deploy to and commence communications if needed. Our initial period of operation is planned to be 24 hours, with extensions added if the situation requires. An ADVON team is currently surveying potential areas.

The next situation update message will be within 48 hours. (Simulated time 1930 hours local, 6/25/08; actual 1945 local 6/3/08)

Vanity Call Fees Expected to Rise

ARLB009 FCC Looks to Raise Vanity Call Sign Fees



The FCC released a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking and Order (NPRM) on May 8 seeking to raise fees for Amateur Radio vanity call signs. Currently, a vanity call sign costs \$11.70 and is good for 10 years; the new fee, if the FCC plan goes through, will go up to \$12.30 for 10 years, an increase of \$.60.

The FCC is authorized by the Communications Act of 1934 (as amended) to collect vanity call sign fees to recover the costs associated with that program. The vanity call sign regulatory fee is payable not only when applying for a new vanity call sign, but also upon renewing a vanity call sign for a new term. "Just In Case" - de Larry (NR3R)

High **S**ierra Antennas has a "**Just In Case**" **HF/VHF/UHF/ antenna** just in time for Field Day or an emergency situation.

Product Description: Set up is less than 5 minutes and covers all amateur bands (70 CM, 2 Meters, 6 Meters, 10 Meters, 12 Meters, 15 Meters, 17 Meters, 20 Meters, 30 Meters, 40 Meters, 60 Meters, 80 Meters) in a very small portable package. it can be stored in a plastic carrying case that measures only 9 x 14 x 20 inches and weighs about 12



pounds. The tripod is 33 inches tall which supports an HF antenna very similar to the Sidekick. There is also a separate VHF/UHF antenna. Coax is included!

Product Review (NR3R): The perfect portable/emergency antenna. All bands to 80M and VHF/UHF. The antenna and tripod are of good quality, sturdy and compact. I set it up in 5 to 8 minutes without reading the instructions. My first contact was Lancaster England [20m]. The antenna was set up on my deck which is about 2 ft. off the ground. Everything fits in a nice sturdy easy to carry box. Pick it up and go!

ARE YOU FIXED, MOBILE, or PORTABLE? - Submitted by Rod (N3XG)

(An EM basic studies training module) -- (From the May EmComm Monthly)

Although it is no longer an FCC requirement to state if your are operating "mobile" or "portable" when identifying, these terms are still often used. But when used, they are commonly incorrectly used after a call sign. To help alleviate some of the confusion (and misuse) we offer this:

The terms mobile and portable have nothing to do with the type of radio being used. If you are at your home location (the location given on your FCC license), you are not "mobile" even if you're in your car in the driveway or parked on the street in front of your house. Also, you are not "portable" if you are using a Handie-Talkie in your back yard.

Here is how the terms have been traditionally defined:

Fixed operation: Radio communications conducted from a specific geographical land location shown on the station license. Normally, your home "shack".

Portable operation: Radio communications conducted from a specific geographical location other than that shown on the station license. For example, a vacation home, or a friend's house. A po rtable station is a solitary hiker using an HT camping at Beaver Lake for a few days. Or, it could be a multi-band, multi-mode, multi-operator Field Day Station, with multiple tents, numerous antennas and several transmitters running up to full legal power with a 12 kW diesel generator running 24 hours a day!

Mobile operation: Radio communications conducted while in motion or during halts at unspecified locations. (Note: It's important to make the distinction between portable and mobile operation. Mobile refers to talking on your 2-meter rig while driving your pick-up truck, while jogging or while backpacking. Portable means operation for an extended period of time at a specific, definable location, such as your retreat cabin."

Maritime mobile and **aeronautical mobile** are occasionally heard. You may also hear pedestrian mobile, wheel chair mobile, bicycle mobile, equestrian mobile, railroad mobile, or other such definitive terms. These terms attract attention, add to the interest and the magic of radio, and are fun to contact.
