





I hope this year's Field Day will have encouraged some to upgrade their license so their participation on HF will continue throughout the year.

Although there are many contests during the year, Field Day is perhaps is the biggest event in an amateur radio operator's year. Maybe the excitement of working HF, erecting antennas and camaraderie will encourage some to submit their Field Day experiences and/or pictures to me for inclusion in the newsletter! The Other VHF -- We all know that amateur 2-meters is only part of the VHF spectrum but what about some of other frequencies on the band? LVARC members Larry (NR3R) and Ed (W3EFT) are members of the Coast Guard Auxiliary. Among their responsibilities, is to provide radio communications for USCG patrols of local lakes and waterways. On Sunday June 21, 2009, Larry acted as communications officer for a patrol at Lake Nockamixon. The USCG and Auxiliary use the dedicated marine frequencies (VHF) for communications. As this is a simplex operation, in order to cover the entire lake area, Larry used a 20' buddipole mast to support his 1/4 wave marine antenna. His radio included a dry box which houses his 5/25 watt Shakespeare marine radio to maintain communications with the crew aboard a boat on patrol on the lake.





Charles "Chuck" Briner, WA3MGD passed away on June 20, 2009 at his home in Breiningsville. Chuck was a regular to our Monday night nets and was once a guest speaker for the club's meeting night. Chuck had an interesting career starting in the Army where he served during World War II in the 124th Cavalry's MARS Task Force.

Chuck had been a television technician for the former Hess's department store, and a ground instructor at the California Flyers School of Aeronautics. Chuck also taught advanced math and physics in for high schools and junior colleges in California.

The first time I met Chuck in person was the night I picked him up to bring him to the club's monthly meeting. Chuck's daughter invited me into the house and I encounter this odd looking assembly that seemed to serve as an antenna. The coax ran to a tight coil of wire soldered to a straightened clothes hanger and then an A-Treat can was on the other end. Chuck told me the can was the perfect capacitance hat for 2 meters and that an ice storm ruined his roof top antenna, so this was his "home brew" 2 meter antenna that he used for nets in Allentown, Schuylkill County and Reading. Chuck said that he measured the resistance with a meter and figured out the rest by doing the calculations (mostly in his head).

Chuck's catch phrase, "From the little village of Breiningsville, this is WA3MGD", will be missed.



INFORMATION NOTICE - From PEMA



The Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency (PEMA) has begun the development of a Pennsylvania Auxiliary Communications Services (ACS) program. The ACS program, which will include the Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Service (RACES), will be a mechanism for augmenting and coordinating existing and future volunteer emergency communications resources in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and for providing auxiliary communications support to Commonwealth departments and agencies.

As we move through the development and implementation process, PEMA will be reach out to stakeholders and partners for assistance and we will be providing updates as milestones are reached. An important note: all procedures, guidance, recommendations and/or requirements currently in effect, as it pertains to RACES or amateur radio operations in support of government, at the state, task force or county level, remain will in effect until or unless PEMA officially announces or provides guidance to the contrary.


