

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- The U.S. Department of Homeland Security's (DHS) Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) today released a revised National Incident Management System (NIMS)! - the national standard for incident management. NIMS establishes standardized incident management processes, protocols, and procedures that all federal, state, tribal and local responders will use to coordinate and conduct response actions.

NIMS expands on the original version released in March 2004 by clarifying existing NIMS concepts, better incorporating preparedness and planning and improving the overall readability of the document. The revised document also differentiates between the purposes of NIMS and the National Response Framework (NRF) by identifying how NIMS provides the action template for the management of incidents, while the NRF provides the policy structure and mechanisms for national-level policy for incident management.

"The National Incident Management System has been the single most significant improvement in incident management since the Department of Homeland Security was formed in 2003," FEMA Administrator David Paulison said. "It has! enhanced interoperability among emergency responders at all levels of government and is the product of a collaborative effort involving hundreds of emergency personnel from across the nation. We incorporated lessons learned from Hurricane Katrina, clarified incident command system concepts, increased emphasis on planning and mutual aid, expanded the intelligence/investigation function, and better aligned the NIMS document with the National Response Framework," said Paulison.

With the oversight of FEMA, the newly released NIMS followed an extensive revision involving over 100 partners from all levels of government, private sector, nongovernmental organizations (NGO), and subject matter experts representing a broad spectrum of emergency management and incident response disciplines. Throughout three official nationwide comment periods, FEMA reviewed nearly 6,000 comments from more than 280 individuals and organizations, including extensive review and recommendations made by the National Advisory Council (NAC).

The basic tenets of NIMS remain the same. There have been several improvements to the revised NIMS document which will aid in readability and usefulness of preparing, preventing, and responding to incidents. For example, the revised document places greater emphasis on the role of preparedness and has reorganized its components to mirror the progression of an incident.


Recognizing the importance of private sector partners and NGOs in incident response, FEMA has ensured that those entities have been more fully integrated throughout NIMS. The new document is consistent with the NRF, and together they provide a single, comprehensive approach to incident management.



"My Two Cents" ... de Mark (AK3M)



Last month, I mentioned that the new TV regulations (digital only) should not directly effect amateur radio. After continued thought, it occurred to me that amateur radio operators should be fundamentally opposed to this legislation and its implementation with respect to emergency communications.

It seems to me that dependency on a, "wired," infrastructure and equipment would be counterproductive. Internet communications are fine as long as your ether net cable is intact, your wireless card is in working and your ISP remains connected to the internet. Email is also fine but has the same limitations, as does Echolink. The only effective amateur emergency communications would be a, "stand alone," HF station or secondary to that, VHF/UHF repeater(s) with its own separate power source and antenna or perhaps VHF/UHF simplex operation.

We are soon going to be dependent on cable or satellite reception *only* for our TV information and entertainment. It seems like we are going backward and are returning to a, "**wired dependency**."

We all know that cable broadcasts are susceptible to natural effects such as thunderstorms and satellite signals can be obscured by something as simple as a wooden structure like your house or even cloud cover. TV stations are regulated by the FCC and they are required to have public emergency communications plans in place. If cable or satellite systems are, down, how are these emergency plans and information to be broadcast? Since there will be few or no, "stand alone," TV receivers with antennas after February, 2009, how will the FCC fulfill their transmissions? *Who* will be able to receive these emergency plans?

I assume that this move from analog to digital broadcasts will save bandwidth and make additional information and programming sharing possible. I also assume that this is progress and I have no problems with progress but I am concerned about an unfriendly plan to disrupt our, "wired," communications capabilities at both the amateur and commercial levels. This would would cause havoc and inefficiency in an emergency situation.

"Wired," dependency may make our every day TV viewing and information sharing better than what we have had in the past but what about the emergency communications aspect? After all, emergency communications are a big part of amateur radio and should continue to be be at all levels including commercial broadcasts. *[Rebuttals are encouraged --- ed.]*




Amateur Radio Shirts Available
