#### **More Than 70 Miles On 5 Watts Simplex?**

Every year, my family takes a vacation at the New Jersey shore and I take my modest boat for fun in the bay. Radio equipment, of course, includes my Yaesu HT and a marine VHF radio mounted aboard my boat. My HT, as well as dedicated marine HT's, are limited to a maximum of 5 watts output. My boat VHF radio has a maximum output of 25 watts. Fortunately, I have never had an occasion to need the Coast Guard's help but have heard many recreational boaters who have needed their help.

I have often wondered how low powered VHF transmissions can be a reliable communications system. I have sat in my boat in Barnegat Bay and heard the Coast Guard's, "Sector Delaware Bay," station which is located in Philadelphia, PA. How can a boat using 5 or even 25 watts, simplex, contact Philadelphia from that location with a, "full quieting," signal?

Well, the answer lies with a new USCG communications system instituted a few years ago. It is called, "Rescue 21" and is both analog and digital. Rescue 21 from Sector Delaware Bay, utilizes 6 towers, which are NOT repeaters, as marine VHF communications is a simplex mode. They rely on these 6 towers placed around their area of responsibility. Three towers are on the, "river," (Delaware) side and three listen to the, ocean. The originating signal is recognized by the closest tower and sent to the Philadelphia station.

The digital component of the this system, means that a boat will have the option to upgrade to the appropriate radio. Boaters, both recreational and commercial, can opt to buy these new radios (digital) although analog radios still work. This transition will take time but most marine VHF radios are now being built and sold with digital capabilities.


#### Ink Cartridge Update de Frank (W3FTU)

THE FOUNDATION FOR AMATEUR RADIO, INC., a non-profit organization with headquarters in Washington, D.C., plans to administer forty-eight (48) scholarships for the academic year 2009 – 2010 to assist licensed Radio Amateurs. The Foundation, composed of over seventy-five local area Amateur Radio Clubs, fully funds two of these scholarships. The remaining forty-rix (46) are administered by the Foundation without cost to the various denors.

Licensed Radio Amaleurs may compete for these awards if they plan to pursue a full-time course of studies beyond high school and are enrolled in or have been accepted for enrollment at an accredited university, college or technical school. The awards range from \$5,000 to \$500 with preference given in some cases to residents of specified geographical areas or the pursuit of certain study programs. Non-USA residents are eligible to apply for some of the scholarships. Clubs, especially those in California, Dolaware, Maryland, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Texas, Virginia and Wisconsin (areas of preferred residence for some of the scholarships), are encouraged to announce these opportunities at their meetings, in their club newsletters, during training classes, on their nots and on their world-wide web home pages.


