





Kidde Recalls to Replace Fire Extinguishers

Due to Failure to Operate WASHINGTON, D.C. - The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, in cooperation with the firm named below, today announced a voluntary recall of the following consumer product. Consumers should stop using recalled products immediately unless otherwise instructed.

Name of product: Kidde XL Fire Extinguishers

Units: About 167,000

Distributor: Walter Kidde Portable Equipment Inc., of Mebane, N.C.



Hazard: The pressurized cylinders in the recalled fire extinguishers could lose pressure and fail to operate. In the event of a fire, this failure could put a consumer and property at risk.

Incidents/Injuries: None reported.

Description: This recall involves the Kidde XL Fire Extinguishers with model numbers FX340SC, FX340H, FX340GW, XL5MR, FX210R, FX340SC-2, FX210W, XL2.5TCZ-4, E-340-3 and with manufacture dates between October 2007 and April 2008. "Kidde" and the model number can be found on the label on the front of the extinguisher. The manufacture year is on the bottom of the extinguisher. If your extinguisher is one of the listed model numbers and is marked with the year 07 or 08, contact Kidde to determine if you have a recalled extinguisher.

Sold at: Department, home, and hardware stores nationwide from October 2007 through April 2008 for about \$35.

Manufactured in: Mexico

Remedy: Consumers should immediately inspect the pressure gauge. If it points to the red zone, contact Kidde to receive a free replacement extinguisher. If the gauge is not in the red zone, but you have questions about an extinguisher within the listed model numbers, please contact Kidde for additional information.

THE K5D PHENOMENON -- de Al Gruenke (KB3JPP)

On 13 February, 1600Z, the K5D phenomenon hit the ham bands like a tsunami. For those of you who have just emerged from a winter-long nap or otherwise oblivious to the goings on



in the amateur radio world, K5P was a Dxpedition to the island of Desecheo, located 14 miles off the coast of Puerto Rico. Desecheo was the No. 2 Most Wanted prefix in Asia and No. 3 Most Wanted in Europe. It was my first attempt at big-time DX.

On Saturday morning, 14 February, I decided to join the fray.

I quickly noted that no matter what band K5D was operating, they were listening UP. Setting the IC746PRO to operate split frequency was no problem, but I was reluctant to transmit on a frequency which I wasn't listening. What if I was interfering with someone? Wasn't this against the Amateur Radio Code of Conduct, if not FCC Part 97? Ethics can be hell.

Another unanswered question was, UP by how much? Most of the articles on operating DX suggest that the DX station is listening one kHz up from the transmitting frequency. Seemed like a good place to start, so I gave it a go on 20 meters..

The first thing that impressed me was the skill of the operators. I listened up a few kHz. It was a veritable cacophony of cw signals, each transmitting its call, with the hope that it would be the one to be chosen. I am only a marginal cw operator, so trying to pick out a particular station was way beyond my capabilities. Yet, these guys were returning calls at what seemed like two or three per minute. The QSO's were obviously short, consisting of the call sign, 5NN TU, wait for the next station. All at better than 30 wpm.

So, I tried up 1 kHz. My measly 100 Watts and 20 wpm sounded downright wimpy compared to all those speed demons, but I decided not to be intimidated.

Then I tried IP 2 kHz. Some DX clusters suggested 4 kHz. Still no success. So it went, all week.

On Thursday, I thought I heard my call answered. I put it in my log, with a question mark. Next day I checked the K5D log on their website, but received no confirmation. What I thought was my call was obviously wishful thinking, maybe even delusions of grandeur.

On Friday, I talked to a fellow ham, Richard Suhar, P.E. and K8WHA, who had just received the Engineer of the Year Award presented by the Lehigh Valley Engineering Council. The subject of K5D came up within ten seconds of introducing ourselves. He had worked them four times. FOUR TIMES, and I didn't work them once. His suggestion was to go up three kHz, and match their cw speed.

There was minimal activity that weekend. I believe the K5D crew took a break .

Monday evening, 24 February, (UTC) it was hot and heavy again.

Taking the advice of K8WHA, I increased my code speed, and took another shot at them.

At 02:05 UTC, on 30 meters, up 2 from their frequency, they answered! To verify, I checked their website log the next day, and there I was, KB3JPP! I'd done it! Persistence, or maybe luck, had paid off.

So, the next day, at around the same time, I tried again on 30 meters, up 1.5. By golly, they answered again! That's number two.

Flush with success, I switched to 40, and, at 02:55 UTC, another QSO, up 1.375.

The next day I checked their website, and sure enough, there I was. Three QSO's with such a sought-after station is not too bad for a neophyte Dxer.

On 26 February, K5D folded their tent and closed shop, after a phenomenal 115,787 QSO's. Because I was actually able to work them, I have renewed respect for the skill and determination of the operators. To be able to copy cw through all that clutter just boggles my mind.

K5D whetted my appetite, and I've since worked a couple other exotic locations, but the K5D phenomenon was unique, in size and in scope. I can't wait for another one.

Emergency Frequencies Declared for Italian Earthquake (Apr 6, 2009) -- An earthquake that registered between 5.8 and 6.3 magnitude struck L'Aquila, the capital of Italy's Abruzzo region, about 65 miles northeast of Rome, early Monday morning. News reports say the quake has killed more than 90 people, with at least 50,000 left homeless. According to cluster spots, 7045 and 3640 kHz are being used as emergency frequencies, so please keep these frequencies clear.
