The Bad News

This year, we provided communications support for the LVH marathon although we were **7 operators short of our goal**. This is the first time I have ever coordinated an ARES event while not having enough operators to fill the positions requested by the event staff. That means, I must face the event coordinator and apologize for not having enough operators. Yes, we ARE volunteers but at a club meeting, the members DID say they wanted and would support more involvement in ARES/community activities. We operate 4 events during the year and each one is unique. Being a 26 mile run, the marathon requires the most operators. In order to fill all positions requested by the staff, we needed 17 operators. As experienced this year, NCS also should have two operators. It is difficult to hunt down event staff with information or questions while manning the radio. If you do not want to spend the whole day involved with communications, you could volunteer for a position near the start of the race. Several operators were home before 10:00 am because their station closed early. In fact, Gary (KB3SFJ) even volunteered to man a second position after his starting position was completed. It is becoming increasingly harder to solicit and get volunteers for ARES events and I can only assume that the majority of LVARC members in fact, no longer want to support ARES activities. We have 84 LVARC members with an average of 35 checkins on the Monday Night ARES/RACES Net. Why is it so difficult to get 17 volunteer operators for ARES events? If you are new to ham radio, you are needed! If you are an experienced ham, you are needed. What is holding you back from volunteering for an ARES event? Let me know so your concerns can be addressed and we can have more ARES volunteers for our 4 annual events.

The Good News

The LVH/VIA marathon was held on a picture perfect day in September, 2009. More than 2.600 people ran either the 1/2 or full marathon starting in Allentown (Bethlehem for the 1/2) and ending at the square in Easton. The organization is fantastic. Transportation from Easton back to Allentown must be coordinated. Scores of volunteers, are needed. EMS and food must be coordinated. Music and entertainment must be arranged and on and on. Every discipline is designated by a colored t-shirt. Communications operators wear red shirts. This makes us visible and accessible. I had many people ask me questions about what I was doing, helping people locate runners, keeping track and routing emergency traffic etc. Phil's (KB3HMK) position as a ham with EMS Command was a great asset. There was no lag between communication of an emergency situation and the implementation of the service.

There is a genuine concern when we hear, "Runner down," or, "Missing runner." In addition to reporting events like these, we want a resolution to the problem. This attitude is admirable and makes for more reliable communications. We go beyond the mechanics of communication as our volunteers provide effective communications content! In addition to the, "We need more Power Aid," to, "Runner Down, " and priority emergency medical traffic. Every call to NCS is different.





RACES / ARES --- What's the Difference?

Do you know the difference between RACES and ARES? ARES stands for Amateur Radio Emergency Services and is sanctioned by the ARRL. Parades, walks etc. are operated under ARES.

RACES means Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Services and is under the control of the county. RACES is only activated at the request of the office of the Lehigh County Emergency Management. The LC EMA may activate RACES in the event of a local emergency. One need not be a member of the LVARC to be a member of RACES and a membership in one organization (RACES/ARES) is not an automatic membership in both. To join LC RACES, contact Lehigh County Emergency Coordinator Jeff Kelly (N3MFT). Remember, you must have completed NIMS (ICS) 100 and 700 to participate in RACES.

Just because you check into the Monday Night Net does NOT mean that you are a registered RACES member.

Classes are free and typically 2 hours long.



The Magic and Mystery of Amateur Radio de Al Gruenke (KB3JPP)

READER SUBMISSION

The evening of 1 June, 2009, I had a QSO with a Yuri Yashin, RA7MP, QTH near Omsk, Asiatic Russia.

He was calling CQ DX on 14.020. He was not a 35 wpm speed demon so characteristic of so many DX stations, just a calm, moderately paced CQ DX, CQ DX, de RA7MP.

So, I answered him, and he responded.

After the normal RST, he gave his name, Yuri, and his QTH, near Omsk. I came back to him with my RST, and my QTH, which I give as 150 km West of New York.

Yuri greeted me and wished me and my family good luck, then said 73.

Shortly thereafter on 14.205 I heard EY7AD from Tajikistan, and talked to him for a few minutes. His name was Abdurakhim. This QSO was more hurried. I gave him my usual response to Russian speakers. Spaciba, tavarich. Dos vidania. Thank you, comrade, good by.

As I filled out my log, I sat back and reflected on what had occurred. Here I was, in the basement of my home in Wescosville, PA, with a gadget slightly larger than a shoebox, communicating with people half a world away. My window to the world is a lowly piece of wire a mere 52 feet long strung between my house and a tree in my back yard. It's barely visible. With the power of a light bulb, I meet and communicate with real people, with real names. living in remote corners of the world

The communication is real, but it differs from the telephone and the internet. There are no intermediaries between me and this person 7,000 miles away. No towers, no satellites, no cables; just a radio and an antenna, with more or less equal equipment at the other end. And, following the protocol of amateur radio, anyone can say to everyone in the world, "I am here, come be my friend".

I understand radio waves, F2 layers, sunspot cycles and all that stuff. But somehow, the technical explanation seems cold and unsatisfactory. Its really a bit mysterious, bordering on magic. The telephone and the internet is easy to understand. There are wires and cables leaving the house, which are somehow connected to more wires and cables, stretching all the way from here to over there. Nothing mysterious about that! Yet, this little box and a piece of wire evokes a different set of emotions. A feeling of satisfaction, accomplishment, and yes, magic.

May it always be so.


