Minutes of the June, 2010 LVARC Meeting

Brian is getting assistance from a college student who is not yet a ham, but is a very avid weather watcher and states that information is also available on a website entitled Lehigh Valley Weather Watchers. Remember when severe weather approaches, monitor 94 as the primary frequency, 70 and 135 are back ups.



W3FTU's 1929 Victor record player

READER SUBMISSION

The First "MP3 Player"

de Frank (W3FTU)

From 1921 to 1929, eight Victor portable models were introduced: the 35, 50, 1-5, 1-6,2-30, 2-35, 2-55, and 2-60. The 50, which sold from 1921 to 1925 (it was Victor's first portable, not the 35), is the most collectible model due to its exquisite wood exterior--mahogany or oak. Other models have fabric or vinyl-like exteriors.

Original price in the late 1920s was \$35. It was introduced to dealers in The Voice of the Victor in April 1928. The design includes the unusual "angle-wind," which means the winding key (or crank) is at an odd angle. NO electronic parts. All sound was generated by vibrations from the needle, and a horn, no speaker. By the way, the needle was good for only about 50 plays!
