"My Two Cents" ... de Mark (AK3M)



On a damp, rainy Sunday, fifteen amateur radio operators turned out to provide communications support for the Lehigh Valley Hospital's marathon which benefits VIA of the Lehigh Valley. Despite the rain which fell for he entire event, these operators remained at their assigned posts until their dismissal. Each operator was assigned to a water station which was manned by volunteers and in a few cases, operators did double duty and assisted in the dispensing of water to runners as they passed their stop. This year saw smooth operation as two major changes were installed since last year. First, a HUGE TNX to Jeff (N3MFT) who was able to secure commercial HT's for the L.V. Hospital's staff which allowed them to communicate with each other instead of relying on cell phone contact. Second, there were two operators at the Net Control position. Net control often gets busy and with the extra radio system (HT's) in place, there was additional traffic to monitor and respond.

Communication between L.V. Hospital's staff and amateur radio operators provided excellent coverage for all event traffic. in addition, Phil (KB3HMK) was the liaison operator for the EMS command vehicle which handled traffic for all emergency medical services. NCS was on scene before 0600 and did not close until 1330.

I am pleased to note that again, amateur radio communications were an essential part of the successful outcome of the 2010 LVH/VIA marathon.

I wish to thank Jeff Ollis (K3UV), Jack Seeger (KC9DQV), Frank Unger (W3FTU), Gary Decker (W3GRD), Mike Williams (KB3TSJ), Bob Green (KE3AW), Jeff Willett (KB3OCP), Don Horst (W3DLH), Ryan Pugh (KB3MPX), Dave Foster (WD5BRP), Don Hoppes (NOVGA), Jeff Kelly (N3MFT) and Larry Miller (NR3R) who acted as co-net control operator. Also, Phil Bigg (KB3HMK) was the contact for EMS services and Bruce Bobo (KB3FIH) was also active as a contact with Lehigh Valley medical services. It must be mentioned that Jeff (K3UV) came from Dresher, PA to help, Mike (KB3TSJ) from Lehighton and Ryan (KB3MPX) from East Greenville. An extra TNX to them for their willingness to travel to help with this marathon.



Race Thoughts - de Brian (KB3QHA)

READER SUBMISSION

As you, the reader, are probably aware, Mark had some difficulty finding volunteers to man the Via Marathon in September. I would like to share some thoughts from a runner who has volunteered at local runs.

Although I am not an official Via spokesman, I can say with confidence that an overwhelming majority of runners are thankful that volunteers are working the race. Running, be it a few miles of a relay leg. 13.1, or the entire 26.2 miles is difficult – both physically and logistically. The runners do their part and make the physical race and the volunteers cover the logistics – they make sure it proceeds. Getting 2000 people to run across the Lehigh Valley, requires a tremendous amount of support. Given the nature of the event – intense physical activity for a prolonged period of time - there is an increased likelihood of emergencies that can arise that require immediate communication to get trained personnel to people who may need it.

Very few people can run 26.2 miles and only a few of those can do so without stopping for water or without assurance that if a medical emergency arose, people are along the course who can get help to someone who has just collapsed or broken a leg.

While these occurrences are rare, they are possible. If the temperature had been 20 degrees warmer, there would have been people collapsing from the heat. I ran the Broad St. Run in Phil adelphia in May. It was 80 degrees at 9:00 am and you are probably aware that the warmer it is, the more dangerous it is to partake in prolonged intense activity. By the end of the race, I saw people along the route being tended to with oxygen. The Broad St. Run is a ten miler with 30,000 participants. Fortunately, it appeared that there were enough volunteers to assist those who succumbed to the heat.

Volunteers know what the runners go through. One doesn't just get up and run a marathon. It takes months of training, whether one is a seasoned runner or just a novice.

Just as runners feel the joy of accomplishment finishing a race. I am quite sure that the volunteers handing out water who stood along a muddy trail in Freemansburg on a dreary Sunday morning felt a sense of accomplishment too.

Again, thanks to all volunteers, be it communications, medical, fire, police, office staff and the mounds of paperwork, staffing water tables, setting up the mile markers, et al. I am probably missing some groups, too, which is a testament to how many people it really takes to make the race happen. Your efforts are noticed! (TNX Brian --- ed.).




