


The August, 2011 LVARC meeting will be held on August 2, 2011 at the TriClover Fire Company at 7:30 pm.





HF Mobile Installation - de Larry (NR3R)

Spent a few hours on a Saturday putting in a Yaesu FT-857D HF/VHF/UHF in the mobile. The radio has a detachable head which makes for a nice neat clean instillation. Main body was put under the passenger seat and the head is mounted on the LM-300 equipment mount made by LIDO. The mount comes with the amps for easy attachment of the detachable plate. All you need to do is loosen the floor seat bolt, slide the mount bracket under the bolt and tighten again. How easy. This mount is a 15 inch gooseneck which can be adjusted to any position. I chose this method due to the inability of mounting the plate and radio on the dashboard. Just was no room for all my gadgets.

If you are in the position trying to find room on your dash for mounting equipment, I highly recommend taking a look at the LM-300


The Ocean Wireless Boys of the Atlantic




daughter of a shipping line magnet, he gets his wish. Jack is assigned to the Ajax, a well worn tanker
