


LVARC ARES In The News


After a week of steady rain, on May 21, the skies cleared and the sun shined on the St. Joseph The worker 4-mile and Fun Run!

"Girls On The Run" - 5K - de Rod (N3XG)

The Lehigh Parkway in Allentown is no stranger to running and walking events. It's picturesque scenery and meandering trail is a peaceful respite away from the hard macadam shell of the City that surrounds it.

This year's Girls on the Run 5K was held on Thursday night, June 2nd at the Lehigh Parkway. This was the second year that the LVARC has been called upon to assist with the event. The event is run by Diakon Lutheran Ministries and as described on their website: "Girls on the Run is a lifechanging, non-profit, prevention program for girls in third through eighth grades. The mission of Girls on the Run is "to educate and prepare girls for a lifetime of self-respect and healthy living." The organizers have received national sponsorship from New Balance, Goody, and Secret, as well as local sponsorship from many fine organizations and businesses.

The role of the LVARC is to assist with track communications and provide race feedback to the event coordinators so that they can monitor the progress of the runners on the course. As you can imagine, with such a wide age group, you have runners, joggers, and walkers, but the goal is that all the girls that start the race, finish the race.

The LVARC had an excellent turnout for a Thursday night. Manning the Water Stops were Jeff (KB3OCP) and Paul (N0KIA). Don (N0VGA) provided a safety point mid-way between the two water stops and John (KB3VNS) walked the entire course with the "Sweep". Charlie (N3WXO) was on his trusty mountain bike and was under the constant surveillance of APRS tracking!

As in previous years, we had the support of Cetronia EMS's Bike Squad for the course EMS. Unlike previous events, we had a direct communications link with Cetronia as well as position tracking. Charlie N3WXO was Bike Mobile on the course and was assigned to ride with the EMS Team. Charlie had both voice communications and was using APRS tracking so that Net Control could monitor their status and position at all times during the event. Had we needed to direct any support onto the track, Net Control could have provided turn by turn directions to anyone that needed to find the team. Although this was more of an experiment with APRS, it worked fantastically!

I would like to extend my personal gratitude to all of our members that take the time to support the community during both planned and unplanned events. Remember, it is only through practice that you can develop skills as an effective communicator. Volunteer early, and volunteer often!













The Pennsylvania State Senate passed a bill this past Wednesday [June 8, 2011] (SB314) setting up new regulations aimed at cell phone usage in Pennsylvania and more specifically focusing on texting while driving, with a majority vote of 41 - 8.



This Bill originally started out to only address "junior" licenses issued to new teenage drivers, and that part of the Bill is now referred to as "Lacey's Law" in honor of Lacey Gallagher.

When this Bill came before the Senate on Wednesday they decided to amend it to also incorporate some cell phone and texting changes to the law, and the good news for Amateur Radio operators that there is one paragraph that specifically excludes mobile Amateur Radio use from the new proposed law changes.

There had been a couple of other bills pending in both the House and Senate (including SB863 and HR8) dealing with cell phone usage, and some were very restrictive in the use of ANY wireless device while driving. which would have included Amateur Radio, among other services.

This new Bill has to be approved by the House and then be signed by the Governor, but hopefully it will go through including the exclusion of mobile Amateur Radio.
