VE's in attendance were Mark (AK3M), Walt (KE3SP) and Larry (NR3R).


REMEMBER: The LVARC offers amateur radio testing. If you want to obtain your entry level license or if you wish to upgrade, the LVARC can help.

Good QRP DX Hunting - de Al Gruenke (KB3JPP)

From September to December, What a time to remember. Good DX galore, Who could ask for anything more. The skip was heavenly, For a Dxer wannabie. Ham Radio has been good to me, Especially when working QRP.

READER SUBMISSION

Sorry for the bad poetry, but there was a definite improvement in DX propagation last fall. I don't know if this is due to the sunspot cycle finally arriving, the end of the Mayan calendar, or just better operating on my part. I suspect a host of reasons other than the latter.

Looking over my activities, the festivities started in September, when I had QRP QSO's on 20 with A45XR, LX9DX, IZ1ASM, and G3MJX all within a half hour! The odd thing (to me) was the time, 4:00 PM EST, 2100z! I started re-thinking my concept that 20 meters was an evening and late night band. So, I started getting on the air earlier and earlier. One can do this when retired. All of you still working for a living, eat your hearts out.

A similar pattern continued the next month, with good propagation starting at 2:00 PM, 1900z. Czech Republic (1 watt), France, Ecuador, a bunch of islands in the Caribbean, Morocco, Cape Verde, Canary Islands, Mauritania, Cyprus, a total of 26 countries in one month.

If it was a new country, I tried worked them first with 100 Watts, then with the K1, 5 Watts. That pattern worked for 5T0SP, 5B4AJC, and D3AA, but mostly I stayed strictly QRP.

The pièce de résistance had to be Japan! JH1GEX, Japan. At 2200z of November 30, I heard the CQ and answered. He came back after the second call, with an RST of 518. Readability was good, tone was excellent, but the strength was so far down in the mud he must have used a backhoe with an extended arm to dig me out! I asked him twice to repeat the RST. I worked him before he appeared on the Ham Radio Deluxe website; i.e., before the pile up. Japan, the Holy Grail of QRPers with only a G5RV Jr. for an antenna.

It was the season for Dxpeditions. In the Caribbean, single operators from the cold climates descended and set up their shack while their XYL's went gallivanting about. Lots of fun, and days in the sun. Seven Japanese operators were QRV on Sint Eustatius Island, 160 miles East of Puerto Rico. They operated as any DX station until 2100z, after which they worked JA-JS' exclusively. I worked them after a week of trying, and waiting. There were Polish Dxpeditions in Mauritania and Cyprus, and single operators from Finland and Germany in the Atlantic islands.

By mid-January, the good times seem to have come to an end. Maybe there were fewer Dxpeditions after Christmas, or the solar winds died down, but it was good while it lasted.

I managed to work fifteen new countries since September, for a total of 104 QRP QSO's. Most of the operators have sent me QSL cards, and I have high hopes for the rest. Like I've said, a few Watts go a long way. Especially when the DX gods are smiling.





LVARC PARTICIPATION INCENTIVE PROGRAM - 2013

PURPOSE

The Participation Incentive Program awards club members who organize and actively participate in club events. This year's recognition is in the form of tickets for a radio raffle to be drawn in December of 2013. There is no limit to the number of tickets that can be awarded to any club member. The tickets will be awarded at each monthly

general membership meeting based on request by event organizers and approval by the Board.

QUALIFYING EVENTS

PUBLIC SERVICE EVENTS

One ticket will be awarded for participation in a public service event such as a 5K walk or run, half or full marathon, or similar. The event organizer will be awarded two tickets for their efforts and an additional ticket if they actually work during the event. Participants who man more than one venue will be eligible for additional ticket(s) depending on the level of effort. The event organizer will document their special effort in their submission. The event organizer will track the participants and submit names in time for the Secretary to alert the Board to approve and award the tickets at the next monthly meeting.

FIELD DAY

Any club member who provides two or more hours of support (setup, teardown, actual on-the-air operation) during field day will be eligible for a ticket. Members who remain on-site and help for more than twelve hours will be granted a second ticket. Any singularly noteworthy achievements will be recognized on recommendation by the Board.

PROGRAMS

Monthly Program Presenters will be granted one ticket for each program they present. Special Club Programs, such as VE Teams, Newsletter Publisher, etc., will be awarded two tickets at the end of the year by the Board. Program Chairpersons may be granted an extra ticket for their participation.

OTHER EVENTS

Members may be awarded one or more tickets for special projects such as BSA liaison, special article for the VOX, repeater repair mission, coffee supply person, etc., if it is brought to the attention of the Board and approved.

Rod thanked Paul and Chuck for a great job on creating the program. Paul will be the incentive tracker.

NOTE: The term Board above refers to the Board of Governors and may be replaced by the Ticket Award Council if requested by the Board of Governors.
