


Need to dispose of a CRT monitor or TV?

12v Power Supplies

Which 12v power supply should I buy for my HF radio?

There are basically two types of power supplies that you will find in use by many radio amateurs. The first is the linear power supply and the second is a switching power supply. Each supply has different advantages which is why some people favor one over the other.

The linear power supplies are typically larger in size and also weigh more than switching supplies for the same output current / voltage. The main advantage of linear supplies is that their DC voltage contains little RF noise. The DC output voltage contains energy at 60Hz (and all harmonics). Since this frequency is very low, there are practically no harmonics that create noise on the amateur bands. I use a linear power supply for my home station.

Switching power supplies are typically smaller and weigh less than linear supplies making them ideal for portable operation. Switching power supplies operate at frequencies of about 100kHz to 10MHz. Because they operate at a high frequency, smaller electronic components can be used in the design. This advantage comes by allowing more noise onto the filtered DC output voltage. This noise is at higher frequencies and the harmonics can sometimes fall inside the HF spectrum. This means that on some frequencies, your radio might have a higher noise floor than if it was powered from a battery or a linear power supply. In most cases the noise is tolerable for even fixed station use.

Either DC power supply will work just fine in most cases. Factors like cost and flexibility of the supply are probably more important than noise performance. Other features like over temperature, over current, and surge protection are nice to have to protect your equipment but they aren't absolutely necessary. When it comes to power supplies, I always like to have a voltage and current meter built into the supply. This way I can make sure my radio isn't drawing more or less power than I expect.
