





On Sunday September 8, 2013, twenty members of the LVARC and DLARC woke up very early to offer their skills and



help a most worthy cause, Via of the Lehigh Valley.

Operators were on site by 0600 on Sunday and ready to go to work after Net Control finally found his position! This event is qualifying run for the Boston marathon! There were more than 3,000 runners in this event.

Net control once again was fortunate enough to able to operate from the LVHN's communication van! Operation of the van was under the direction of the LVARC's own **Bruce** Bobo (**KB3FIH**). Because the van had several VHF/UHF radios, net control operators were required to monitor not only the 146.94 repeater but also the event staff's commercial UHF frequency which they used by HT's supplied by Jeff (N3MFT) and finally Northampton County's EMS frequencies. The job of net control was often very busy.

A directed net was opened at 0653 and the fun began at 0700 from the full marathon's start at the Lehigh Valley Hospital located on Cedar Crest Boulevard. The LVARV's 146.940 repeater was the primary frequency used during the event with the 147.135 as a back up. The DLARC offered their 146.70 repeater to us should we have needed it.

The 20 operators involved in the event handled all levels of traffic from routine to emergency! All operators demonstrated the skills necessary for effective communication during the entire event. There were 16 water stops manned by amateur radio operators in addition to one on the "sag wagon," and one operator who acted as the amateur radio link to EMS control. There were 12 EMS calls and 27 calls to the "sag wagon, during the event that required ham radio communications." Communications and "sag wagon," operations were not interrupted even when the "sag wagon," experienced a flat tire.

The net was closed at 1335. I wish to thank and acknowledge the following operators who came out very early on a beautiful Sunday to again demonstrate that our hobby has its place in community service!
