



Question: How important is SWR really? What is a good SWR report and how far off from that value is still OK?

Answer: SWR can be considered to be the efficiency of your antenna system. You hear people talk about SWR more with HF antennas because most VHF/UHF vertical antennas are quite broad banded – meaning no antenna tuning is required. HF antennas typically require adjustments during installation to optimize SWR on your favorite HF bands. Factors like height above ground and the impact of nearby objects are also more significant to antenna SWR on HF bands.

Low SWR is good but it isn't necessary to achieve a 1.1:1 match with an antenna. Most radios can work with levels as high as 3:1 without being damaged. An SWR of 2.1:1 will be 87% efficient and this is good enough for matching to any radio. The amount of power that is reflected is relatively insignificant and the SWR won't degrade your signal strength. For my home station, I try to keep my SWR to 2.1:1 or less on the frequencies I operate but I have no problem operating almost up to 3:1 on occasion.

On the topic of SWR, it is a good thing to check your SWR periodically to make sure everything is still operating as you expected. (Wire antennas may stretch over time, connections may break, water or moisture damage may occur, as well as numerous



other things).


