**Committee Reports:** Repeater: 146.094 is still having light volume problems. The county owns this repeater and a work order has been placed to trouble shoot the issue. As long as the repeater is functional it probably will not have a high priority with the county.

**Club Station:** Rod will ask the board members to form a committee to work with Chief Johnson. They will work with Chief Johnson to develop the station. Rod will contact Board Member by email.

**Program:** The program for tonight will be Net Operations and Public Service events. The subject for the hands on night will be Go Kits and Portable Setup. Next month the program topic will be Field Day. Field Day will be the last weekend of June (June 28 & 29).

**Volunteer Examiners:** Due to Good Friday, there was no testing conducted in April. The next test session will be May 16, 2014. Mark (AK3M) reported to Rod that there are 3 individuals signed up for that test. Due to school closures in June and July there will be tests at the Hanover Elementary site. We will be conducting walk-in testing during field day on June 28 from 2 PM to 4 PM. Individuals need to bring a copy of ID for new licenses and a copy of their existing license for license upgrades. The August test session will be held at the Hanover elementary school and the date will be moved to the fifth Friday in August (August 29). The remainder of the test schedules will be in the club newsletter. The Technician question pool will expire on June 30 and a new question pool will be in effect as of July 1.

**ARES:** On Sunday April 27 there were 14 LVARC members that turned out to support the Lehigh Valley Road Runner/Saint Luke's half marathon. The next ARES event will be the Girls on the Run on June 5 in the Lehigh Parkway. Rod needs volunteers to support the event. Please contact Rod (N3XG). **Old Business:** The equipment from the Eastern PA EMS has been listed in the News Letter. We have made \$80 from the scrap metal and \$85 from the sale of one power supply and power amplifier. The equipment will be available for the rest of May at the prices in the newsletter. After May the equipment will be offered for sale at Ham Fests or on line. The Club picnic will be on July 19 at the Upper Macungie Park on Rt. 100.

#### **New Business:**

We will be doing a joint raffle with the North Catasauqua Fire Department. Tickets will be available for sale at the June meeting and throughout the month of June. The drawing is July 4.

John (AB3LZ) was contacted by the QSL Card Bureau and informed that the club had numerous QSL card on file. John has sent them 3 envelopes and we have received past QSL cards back to 1997. Rod noted that the club does not have QSL cards. We should be responding to QSL's. Scott (KB3YOT) placed a motion to purchase QSL cards. A \$100 limit was placed on the purchase. John (AB3LZ) volunteered to coordinate the card design. Gary (N3GRD) seconded the motion. The motion was carried with a unanimous Yes vote.

Rod discussed that at the last two Field Days we used an OCF antenna supplied by club members. It was suggested that the Club should purchase an OCF for field use and as a back-up antenna when we establish a club station. Robin placed a motion to purchase an 80 meter OCF antenna from Hy Power in Bethlehem. The antenna will be kept with the clubs HF rig. Scott (KB3YOT) seconded the motion. The motion was carried with a unanimous Yes vote.

#### Good of the Order:

Scott (KB3YOT) plans to participate in SOTA (Summits on the Air) this summer. Scott is looking for interested parties to participate with him. Scott will work on an article for the new letter describing SOTA. There are a number of SOTA peaks in Eastern PA. Dates when Scott plans hikes to SOTA summits will be published in the newsletter. 

#### What **IS** Field Day? de Mark (AK3M)



Field Day is perhaps the biggest event in an amateur radio operator's year but what exactly IS Field Day? Well, some say it is an emergency preparedness event, as operators are encouraged to operate under emergency conditions where generators, coolers, portable antennas and grills are used. Others say it is a contest, as operators and clubs are encouraged to log their contacts and submit their scores to the ARRL, hopeful for recognition. Field Day is also an event that challenges and sharpens the operator's skills during often difficult HF operation (phone and CW).

### **2014 FCC Licensing Statistics**

The below chart shows first quarter results for FCC license activity over the past few years. The number of new US Amateurs in the database continues to grow each year while upgraded license transactions remains fairly steady.

During the first quarter of 2014, the FCC issued 8,943 new licenses, a 16% gain in new Amateurs over the same period last year.

As of March 31, 2014, 2,719 Amateurs upgraded their licenses during the same time period, resulting in a 13% gain over 2013.

We are seeing outstanding results so far this year!



# First ARES Event of 2014 Very Successful!

 $oldsymbol{0}$ n a very overcast, breezy, cold morning on April 27, 2014, fourteen LVARC members turned out

to provide communications support for the first ARES event of 2014. The event was the **St. Luke's Half Marathon** sponsored and organized by the Lehigh Valley Road Runners.

Almost 4,000 runners participated in both the 5K and half marathon held that Sunday morning. LVARC operators were all at their assigned site much in advance of the event start and were able to adapt to situations that arose early.

A directed net was opened at 0755 and closed at 1140. The old adage of, "Anything can (and will) happen," came true. The selection of the event or primary repeater was changed several time before the start of the run. All operators were able to adapt and communications went smoothly. Although very cool to those not running, the weather was perfect for an event like this. I was told by the event medical staff that cooler weather reduces their cases of heat exhaustion and dehydration. With more than 4,000 runners, our operators handled only 3 cases where attention was necessary. Communications in an event like this, can vary from needing more cups at a water station, to medical emergencies. All LVARC operators handled traffic in a manner as professionally as an amateur can!

Participating in the event included, Mark (AK3M) and Larry (NR3R) at Net Control, Scott (KB3YOT), Judy (KB3YOS), John (KB3VNS), Jack (KC9DQV), Rex (KC1WE), Mike (KC3BLF), John (AB3LZ), Don (W3DLH), Kenny (KC3BLE), Bob (WB3JSZ), Don (N0VGA), and Dave (W3AMC).



#### **Zoning Battle - forwarded** by Chuck (WB6CDY)

READER SUBMISSION

As some of you know, I'm involved in assisting a well-known radio amateur in a significant amateur radio antenna zoning battle in the greater Philadelphia area. Time and space here does not permit me to detail all that has occurred in the past few months. However, to those of you that are aware and have shown support for the amateur involved, WN3A, I wish to thank you on behalf of Jeff and his family for your kind words of encouragement.

The zoning board hearings, being conducted in a formal trial-like setting, began April 30 at 7 PM and ran until 10 PM as we offered at least 40 exhibits for the record so far. We expect several more evenings of hearing time, but I write to inform those coming back to view the next session on Monday, May 5, the hearing location was just changed at the last minute. It is no longer at the township building as announced, but has been moved to the large meeting room at the Tredyffrin Public Library, 582 Upper Gulph Rd, Strafford, Chester County, Pennsylvania at 7 PM because of the need for a larger room given the number of people from the neighborhood that wish to attend and oppose the amateur radio tower. Many of you sent representatives from your club's from many miles away, but I did not keep a list of those of you who introduced yourself before or after the first hearing.

Please pass the word, as those traveling down to the township building in Chester County to see the next session will be met with a poster on the door indicating a hearing has been moved to a location several miles away. Maybe I can save you some trouble.

Those of you not aware of Jeff's predicament, I posted a letter I sent to all the hams we could identify as living in either Tredyffrin and Schulykill Townships in the download section of the ARRL web page for EPA. The letter explains more about this matter. Both of these townships as well as the neighbors are separately opposing Jeff's application for a 180- foot Rohn self-supporting tower on his approximately 233 foot by 660 foot, 3 acre wooded lot next to his home.

Jeff is a serious VHF, UHF and microwave operator and most of the antennas will be small in that regard, not larger HF arrays that you might find at say a contest station. The almost 100 foot trees plus the 70 foot rise at the ridge in front of him require this height, which we can surely prove. This case will likely end up in the courts for some years and will have a significant effect, in my view, on amateur radio towers in the various states which comprise the Third Circuit Court of the United States.

The opposition raised by very competent Township and other opposing lawyers who clearly studied PRB-1 cases include reference to the cell phone laws supposedly requiring the amateur to make his tower available to cell phone carriers for colocation if they demand it, (I can't make this stuff up), and the fact that Jeff can simply

increase his power to get through all the foliage attenuation, as well as suggesting the ham should be satisfied with talking locally through repeaters. Jeff does maintains repeaters but he is personally a weak signal 50 MHz and above operator. Opponents presented that he can use long wire antennas and "loops" (we don't know what they mean here either) even at VHF and UHF to work effectively. They have also raised an interesting argument that a 180-foot Rohn self-supporting tower is commonly and universally found in industrial or factory settings as there are very few, if any, radio amateurs in the area that have or need such a tower.

Therefore, they argue no exemption under PRB-1 and state law applies. Also, one of Jeff's repeater on the tower if used by others is not for Jeff's own use and therefor is not subject to exemptions. This is a short list of the many arguments the opponents have and we expect a long line of opponent expert witnesses arguing against the tower on numerous grounds as well.

Please be assured that we know how to meet all these objections but the decision on the facts, of course, remains with the many panel members who will render a written decision for the zoning Board of appeals. They are the jury on the facts and apply the applicable law as well. Some radio amateur with professional engineering and emergency response credentials have stepped up to help.

They may make all the difference. By the way, if you are a real estate appraiser with experience in such matters as cell phone and other tower effects on property values, we desperately need to speak with you.

I appeared at a very well attended public meeting on April 21 in Tredyffrin Township to address the Board of Supervisors of that township who voted to oppose amateur radio antennas not just in the present case, but resolved to oppose them anywhere in the Township. The meeting was recorded in video and is available at the Tredyffrin Township Board of Supervisors web page. Two and 1/2 hours into the meeting Jeff's amateur radio antenna was raised under new business to pass a resolution opposing Jeff and other radio amateurs. I was given the opportunity to speak for 10 minutes over the jeering of the neighbors who were anything but friendly as you can imagine. "We don't love towers and we don't love hams" an opponent placed on the record at that earlier meeting.

If you're with one of the clubs who sent representatives, please pass the word that, because of the neighbors outcries, the next hearing is moved to a new larger location to accommodate what I believe will be a hostile crowd. If you're coming down again, and all are welcome, drop me a note so I can keep you on a list to inform you of developments. We expect the hearings to be completed by July and no decision until as late as August. Keep the faith.

And both Jeff and I will see you on the radio.
