


Nominations for the Pres Schuler award for "Excellence In Amateur Radio / LVARC," are also being taken.

# Early Christmas - de Mark (AK3M)

Christmas came early to me this year. On September

26, 2014, I bid on a Heathkit HW-32A on Ebay and won the bid! Actually, I was the only bidder but that's OK. At a meeting several months ago, I told Carl (K3ATX) that I would love to have my old rig back again.



He found one on Ebay and emailed me that one was available. The radio was reportedly in working order. I have never bid on anything on Ebay and was a bit fearful but the radio was exactly what I wanted, so I forged ahead. The radio came complete with the power supply, homebrew dummy load, original Heath external speaker, SWR meter, RU-58 cables, mobile mounting bracket 3 manuals and an original Heathkit microphone. *Way too good of a deal to pass up!* 

My first rig as a novice (1968) was a Heathkit HW-16, a CW only radio which was crystal controlled. CW only and crystal controlled was the regulation at that time for Novice operators. After upgrading to General, I wanted an SSB radio and decided on the HW-32A. It was one of Heathkit's single band transceivers. They made three. One for 40m, 80m and 20m. The HW-32A is the 20 meter SSB band radio. I had many wonderful experiences on the air with that radio and it was in the days when DX was good. I wanted to re-experience those days and TNX to Carl and the former ham in Ohio, I can.

### National Traffic System Radiogram



If you listened to the SET on Saturday October 4, 2014, you heard many messages being passed. These messages were passed using the NTS format and were using the **NTS radiogram** form. This form is a national standard for amateur operators who handle traffic on HF nets. During the local LVARC ARES events, we too pass traffic but usually without the formality of the NTS system. We DO however, follow the protocol of using, **routine, priority** and **emergency** categories to help route traffic in an orderly fashion.




