


There will be Walk-In license testing at the LVARC Field Day site on Saturday June 27, 2015 for 2 hours (2-4 pm).

RACES vs. ARES

Not this again?!?!? I was recently contacted by a new ham who asked if the LVARC was or would be called out for the fire at Blue Mountain in Lehigh County as the LC EMA mobile unit was being used. He then asked if this is something in which ARES is involved. That prompted me to add this to the newsletter again, mostly for new hams, realizing that there still is confusion about the difference.

Rule of thumb: RACES is county managed and ARES is club managed. The 5K's, half marathons and marathons, etc., are used for community events and managed by the LVARC. Lehigh Country does NOT get involved with those events. Lehigh County events are handled by the county EMA. LVARC communications for county events only happen when the county requests our help. L.C. will only use RACES when something major happens. RACES would be used to provide secondary communications when normal county comms are inundated. Remember, you need at least ICS 100 AND ICS 700 to participate if Lehigh County EMA calls us out for county communications support

Early on Sunday April 26, fifteen LVARC hams turned out to provide communications support for the St. Luke's Half Marathon. This was the first ARES HALF MARATHON

The St. Luke's Half Marathon is an event the LVARC has helped with communications for many years. Dr. Mike Martinez offered another successful year as participant injuries were light. About 2,245 people participated in this event.

A directed net was opened at 0750 and remained open until 1115. Amateur radio communications were responsible for assisting eight people who required medical and/or transportation attention with one piece of routine traffic initiated by event officials to their auxiliary medical tent regarding supplies storage. Once again, the LVARC ARES team was on time and handled all communications as professionally as amateurs can! I wish to thank the following operators for their time and expertise with event communications. 



REMEMBER: I keep a list of LVARC members who have taken the Incident Command System (ICS) courses. I have a total of 30 members who have taken these courses BUT only 25 are RACES eligible. That means they have taken only ONE ICS course. My list could be in error but remember that BOTH ICS AND ICS 700 are the minimum requirements for RACES participation. If you are in doubt about the courses you have taken and that are on my records, email me and I will let you know what is on my list.
