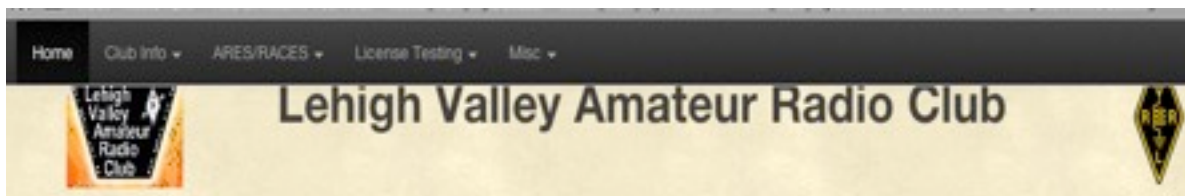

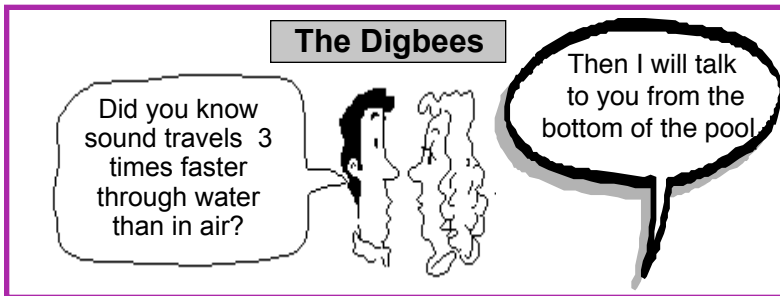

April Fools' Day, sometimes called All Fools' Day, is one of the most lighthearted days of the year. Its origins are uncertain. *Befitting for a holiday like this!*

Did you know that Pennsylvania has a, “**Yellow Dot**” Program? This information is from my township’s newsletter. The program is a cooperative effort among the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation, Health and Aging, the Pennsylvania State Police, the Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission and First Responders and local law enforcement.

What Is the Yellow Dot Program? Participants complete a personal information form, which includes the participant’s name, emergency contact information, medical history and medication, etc. A photo showing only the participant’s head and shoulders is then taped to the information sheet. This information sheet is then placed in the glove compartment of the vehicle.

A yellow dot decal is provided in the program kit and is placed in the lower left corner of the participant’s vehicle’s rear windshield. This yellow dot decal alerts first responders that vital information can be found in the glove box.

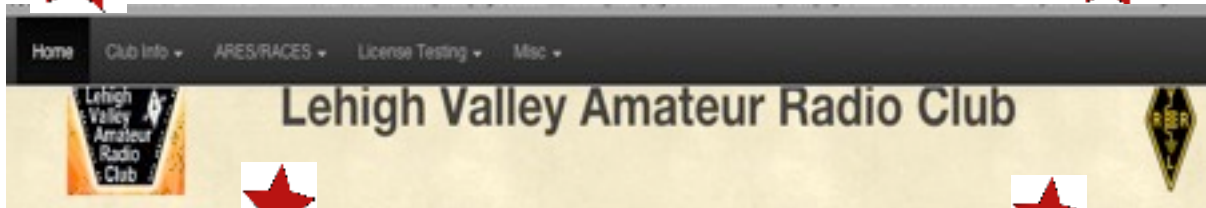

Share How You Got Started In Amateur Radio

NEW FEATURE

John (W3AMD) was the inspiration for this new feature. While working on the new LVARC web site, my (AK3M) LVARC history came up during a conversation with him. He asked me if I would write up my road to amateur radio and put it in the VOX. It occurred to me that this would be a great, "interactive," feature for the newsletter where LVARC members can tell *their* journey to amateur radio.

John started this feature and his story follows.

Please send me (AK3M) your description of how *you* got started in amateur radio and one per month will be published in the VOX.

"How I got started in Amateur Radio" - de John (W3AMD) , Formally KC3ASE

I was born on February 12, 1974 to my parents Bernhard and Susan. My father is German and was born and lived in Kohn until immigration to America and my mother was born in America having Swedish and Scottish decent. I have a younger brother Richard who lives also in PA. My father had worked for Nynex telephone company in NY, which is now Verizon. My mother was our homemaker. I have three children Anna 19, Abigail 18, and John Jr. 3.

Even as a child in school I had a knack for exploration and science. My friends and I would explore the areas around us and we all got into radio when we were teenagers. In growing up on Long Island though, we could never go too far without getting to the ocean. I was about 6 when being able to realize what a CB radio was that my dad had used in the car to get traffic information for trips. When you go off the island there are only a few ways out and you better have the best one!

I had already got a gift one Christmas some years prior of a 50 in 1 electronic set ,of course from Radio Shack. My father helped me put together the experiments and explain what the items were from the experience in his employment. I did most of the experiments in the manual but found myself highlighting the radio ones. Then, way too early I did my own experiment without enough understanding and placed a 9V battery directly to an LED. Boy it was bright for a few seconds until the magic smoke was let out.

When I was 14 , my dad no longer used the radio so much and saw my interest continue in it. He let me have his radio and we set it up in my room. I was afraid to use it a little at first but I quickly came into it. When I was first on there were only a few people that would use it in the area but by the time I was 18 there were about 30 people who would talk night to night. At about 16 I had looked into Amateur radio but there was Morse Code requirements which I didn't yet understand.

In the background and during this time frame I had also a Commodore VIC 20 introduced to me by my organ teacher when I was about 12. I was simultaneously playing and experimenting with both. I started in BASIC as he also taught me how to do basic programming and gave me some examples. Later on, I bought, with my father's help, a Commodore 64 with a tape drive. Oh, the things I could do now. I progressed further and further into programming understanding BASIC and later on Pascal and machine language. I got my first PC computer in 1992 with Windows 3.1 and I came to a crossroads. I had been working on both software and hardware sides and for me, I took off with software first.

On Long Island when I was 18 I had been working retail and retail management levels. Realizing that I wanted to do something different and use my skills with software and electronics, I had developed. I entered the USAF at 22 years old in 1996 and completed 4 years with honors.

After this period, I joined with Sumitomo Cryogenics Inc. where I work as an Engineer predominantly doing software development but have also back been expanding back into hardware. I have been an inventor of the engineers in our group and are on quite a few of our company patents and also the lead on a few.

I came back into radio ~3 years ago. I got my technician's license in 2013, my General license the year after and followed it up with the trifecta with my Extra in 2015. For me, it was the completion of a dream. When I looked up testing, I was so surprised that Morse Code was no longer a requirement of the test. Additionally, Hams have brought me more back into electronics so now I'm found trying to put both pieces together and there's a lot of work to be done.

My current projects are the W3OI website with the communication committee, revamping the NEC antenna modeling software and mostly fun but not always my full time employment! I joined W3OI in 2013 when I got my license and Dave W3AMC has been my Elmer ever since. Two years later, the W3AMD call became available and I grabbed it after talking with Dave. It is my honor to have the callsign behind his. ----- 73, John W3AMD

No More Paper Copies of your Ham License

As you may know, the FCC no longer sends you paper copies of your license. You can print a *Reference Copy* of you license from the FF web site. Here are the steps for printing your license.

1. **<http://wireless.fcc.gov/uls/index.htm?job=home>**
2. click (select) **licenses**
3. type you call in the search box
4. click on your call
5. click on the **ADMIN** tab
6. select **AUTHORIZATON-LICENSEE**

A **REFERENCE COPY** of your license will download to your computer or be displayed for screen capture , depending on your set up. The result will be a display suitable for printing.

More LVARC Improvements!

In addition to a new website and a new LVARC radio shack, the LVARC repeaters are being updated!

The following LVARC repeater and voter information was submitted by Jeff Kelly (N3MFT).

In July of 2015, I [Jeff] applied for a PEMA radiation protection grant to replace the 146.94 repeater. The previous 2 repeaters were purchased with these grants. Since we are a host county for Limerick we can apply and use these funds for RACES communications. They should be awarding Motorola the contract in the next 30 days (2/24/16).

We (the LVARC) we will be getting is a new 94 repeater, a MTR 3000 repeater with a new CAT 200 controller a new used voter installed. I knew this was coming so I purchased 2 new used MTR2000 voting receivers to donate to the project so everything will be newer technology. So by mid to late April, the new system will be online and the old 94 repeater will be in standby mode if anything should happen to the new one. I will keep you posted as this gets closer to being completed. The county will then place the new system under their 24x7 service contract with Motorola.
