## There is a 'NEW' Player in the Amateur HT Market

Does the name Retevis ring any bells? Well, there is a kind of new player entering the American ham marketplace. I say kind of new because it seems that Retevis and Baofeng seem to have some sort of relationship, and a number of items in the Baofeng line have analogues in the Retevis line. There is also another brand name Ailunce that is intended to be a ham-only line of radios.

There are some different things that might interest you however. One is the Retevis RT-23, available through Amazon for \$60. It is a dual-band HT with two unique features. The first is that it has true dual receive. You will see why in a second. That means that you can listen simultaneously to two different channels. It is not scanning channels, it is actually two separate receivers listening to those channels. You can assign different volume levels so that one channel has the dominant audio.

Besides being a nice feature in itself, the dual receive is necessary for the other function this radio can do - it is a self-contained cross-band repeater. That is, you can set the HT to receive on 440 and repeat on 146-148 (and vice versa), something you needed two radios and a controller to do before.

There is also supposed to be a true DMR Retevis radio on the market soon. You can read about Retevis products on the Retevis blog:




