"I want to volunteer for LVARC ARES events but I don't know what I am supposed to do."

"What will I need to know and do if I volunteer for an ARES event?"

The LVARC provides communication support for several community events through out the year. Volunteers are positioned around the course of the event. Their job is to provide communications between their position and the net control station. The net control operator has access to the event coordinator(s) and emergency medical services (EMS).

Your job will be to pass ANY/ALL traffic between your station to/from the Net Control Station. That could be anything from, "My station needs more drink cups," to reporting a medical emergency. You are NOT there to assist water stop personnel hand out drinks, unless you want to. You are NOT there to direct vehicular traffic and you are NOT there to provide medical services, unless you are appropriately trained. You ARE there to provide communications to/from your station to net control.

You will need equipment that will keep you on the air for about 4 hours. A charged HT and spare batteries along with a folding chair etc. is all the equipment you should need to participate in an ARES event.

I hope this helps a little but before you decide NOT to volunteer because you don't know what to do, contact me (Mark - AK3M) and ask any questions you have.

2018 ARES Review - de Mark (AK3M)

At Mike's (KC3BLF) request, I did a review of 2018 ARES participants. I use the term participants and not members because there really is no criteria for membership in ARES as there is for RACES.



This review showed that 25 *different* LVARC members participated in six ARES events in 2018. Many participated in more than one event. Using 83 as an LVARC membership total (from Paul), that figures as **30.12% of LVARC members participated in ARES events in 2018**!

Lehigh and Northampton Counties Hold Joint Simplex Drill - de Mike (KC3BLF)



On Saturday morning, March 9th, LVARC supported Lehigh County (and some parts of Northampton) in a joint Lehigh-Northampton County simplex radio drill. Simplex radio is emergency communication at its most basic form...direct radio to radio without any kind of infrastructure required (power, repeater, internet...nothing). In this drill we primarily used FM voice. There was a packet station available for digital messages in Bethlehem for those who wanted to try that. The goal of this exercise was to test our ability to communicate directly to an EOC from an anticipated shelter location in both counties. I am happy to say that Lehigh County was very well covered. We had operators cover NW Lehigh High School in New Tripoli (which worked great to Lehigh EOC), Northern Lehigh HS, Dieruff High School, Saucon Valley High School (Northampton), most of the major hospitals in Lehigh (and we covered St. Luke's Anderson in Northampton) and various other potential sites including the club station at Tri-Clover FD. Some operated from home, which was fine. You never know where an incident may originate, and it might be in your neighborhood.

Thanks to those who came out to participate. I understand another drill like this is planned for Fall. We may have our own simplex frequency this time in Lehigh County, which should make things a little easier. We may try another mode (possibly Dstar digital simplex) on a secondary frequency.

Emergency communications and our ability to provide something of this nature...a backup communications mode requiring no outside support of any kind, is a hallmark of amateur radio and a major (perhaps THE major) justification for our frequency allocation from the FCC.

160.800 - NS Road ch 1 161.070 - NS Road ch 2 160.860 - NS Road ch 3 160.980 - NS Road ch 4



Reading and Northern

161.310 - RBMN ch 1 160.770 - RBMN ch 2 160.470 - RBMN ch 3 160.800 - RBMN ch 4

These two are the most active railroads. There are several others, but these will have the most traffic. - de Chris (KC3MLI)
