2019 St. Luke's Half Marathon A Big Success! - de AK3M

The St. Luke's Half Marathon was held on Sunday April 28, 2019. This event was the first LVARC ARES event of 2019. Twenty LVARC members turned out to provide communications support for this 13+ mile event!

The day began as very cool and overcast, later to change to rain finally ending about an hour before the end of the run. About 1,300 runners participated in this run.

There were three firsts for this event. First, Chris (N3RPV) was aboard the, "Sag Wagon," for easy deployment for those runners who could not finish but were not candidates for EMS service. Second, Allentown Police and EMS services asked for **OUR** operating frequency so they could monitor amateur radio communications. As it turned out, I even went to their command vehicle and operated Net Control from there! And last, Mike (KC3BLF) instituted APRS technology. This event, as all the events, transforms and revises needs with every event.

A directed net was initiated at 0802 and closed at 1124. There is a time limit on services as the closed streets, reopen after three hours. There were three EMS related incidents which were handled effectively and quickly because of our operators. EMS command was informed and these cases were resolved in minutes.



D-Star Reflector News

Over the past few months there have been several important changes to D-Star Reflector 020. http://ref020.dstargateway.org

One of the positive changes affecting us here in the Lehigh Valley is that we have arranged the reflectors "B" module to be assigned to primary use for Eastern PA operators.

Reflector 020 A (20 Alpha) will continue to serve NJ /NY and all wide area linking. The Monday night D-Star Net will continue on 20 Alpha at its usual time of 8 pm.

The reflector, basically a computer that ties repeaters together, is open to all properly licensed operators.

Currently the only repeater linked to the reflector is the W3OI "C" (2 Meter) repeater. We have hopes of having both W3OK and AA3E come aboard in the future.

The reason for quasi dedicating 20 Bravo is that at peak usage times, 20 Alpha gets very robust, NJ/NY local traffic and makes it tougher on PA users to get in.

Also New - Reflector 20 Alpha is now connected, full time, to the Windows and Android "Peanut application".

Simply select XRF020C from the drop down box in the Peanut application.

We could have a link to 20 Bravo if we find there is sufficient use of the reflector to warrant the implementation.

Our exact position was known because my radio beacons via the Amateur Radio APRS system which allows for my exact location to be know and show on a map available from the Internet.

The dauphin county emergency services EMS and firefights were outstanding and despite rain and 48 degree weather they carried on!! My friend was hospitalized and all is now well!

Thanks to the emergency services and Amateur radio ... when all else fails!

ARES Vests - de Mark (AK3M)

ARES season is here and if you plan to volunteer your time for one or more events, you may have heard that you have to wear a vest. Please be advised that there is **NO specific dress necessary**. All you need is your LVARC ID but a reflective vest **IS** helpful for two reasons. First, it helps event participants identify you as a source for help. Second, many vests have pockets which help you stow and carry your radio and gear.

If you plan to get a vest, there are several sources depending on how much you want to spend and what options you choose. You can get an inexpensive reflective vest from Harbor Freight (https://



www.harborfreight.com/reflective-safety-vest-large-94701.html), you can get one from the ARRL store (https://www.arrl.org/shop/ARES-Deployment-Vest-Mesh) or you can perform an internet search using, "reflective vest," (or similar), as search text. Many operators seem to prefer yellow but that is a personal choice. Orange can also be used.
