Sunday September 8, 2019 turned out to be a terrific day for the St. Luke's/VIA Marathon. **Twenty two** LVARC operators turned out to provide communication support for this event! On a beautiful sunny day, these operators arrived at their pre-assigned locations in more than enough time for the event. There were fourteen operators, "in the field" (around the course), five operators on sag wagons and three at the net control station site.

There were a few minor injuries reported but nothing that really required EMS attention. Most were taken care of at or near the scene and were handled appropriately by Sag Wagon transportation. A directed net was opened at 0652 and closed at 1102. There were more than 2,500 runners participating in this event. VIA is the beneficiary of this event which is terrific organization for children and adults with disabilities.




