




# CONGRATULATIONS

1. Log into FCC system at <a href="https://wireless2.fcc.gov/UlsEntry/licManager/login.jsp">https://wireless2.fcc.gov/UlsEntry/licManager/login.jsp</a>.

The FRN and password are the same you use when applying for Vanity callsigns and address changes.

If you don't know your FRN number, go to FCC ULS License Search and search for your callsign. Your FRN will be listed in the column FRN.

- 2. On the left side menu, click on 'Download Electronic Authorizations'.
- 3. On the new page, select the callsign you wanna print the license for and click on the button 'ADD '.
- 4. Now, on the bottom right of the page, click on the button 'Download >'. Make sure your pop-up blocker is disable, otherwise you won't be able to download the PDF for your license.

# Before you take down that tree, return those socks, and put the holidays away for 2020, enjoy these Christmas traditions

Every year, we turn to favorite holiday traditions to bring good cheer. Here are fun facts about seven holiday traditions that have come to us from right in the U.S. and around the world.

- 1. **Christmas Trees:** The Christmas tree tradition came from Dutch and German immigrants to the United States, starting in the 1840s. The first Christmas tree lot was at Washington Market in New York City in 1851.
- 2. **Yule Log:** The yule log itself was part of Nordic solstice traditions. The 24-hour-aday yule log on television debuted in 1966 on WPIX-TV in New York, as a seventeen second loop that repeated all day and all night.
- 3. **The Nutcracker:** The Nutcracker ballet premiered in St. Petersburg, Russia on December 18,1892. It was first performed in the U.S. by the San Francisco Ballet in 1944.
- 4. **Holiday Sweater Parties:** Although holiday sweaters have been around for a long time, the trend of "ugly sweater" parties started in Vancouver, Canada in the early 2000s.
- 5. **Poinsettias:** Poinsettias are native to Central America. Their association with Christmas has its origins in a Mexican Christmas legend in which the flowers appeared in a nativity scene. John Roberts Poinsett, the first U.S. ambassador to Mexico brought the plants back to the U.S. in the 1800s.
- 6. **Window Candles:** A single, decorative candle in the window originated in Williamsburg, VA in the 1930s, as a way of signifying which historic buildings were open during the holiday season.
- 7. **Gingerbread:** Ginger sweet treats have been around for more than a thousand years, but the gingerbread man cookie came from the bakery of the royal gingerbread maker of Queen Elizabeth I in the 16th century. Gingerbread houses were popular in Germany around the same time. The popularity of gingerbread as a holiday treat is likely due to its warming and medicinal properties perfect for the holiday season!





## Read the FCC RF Safety Rules

#### FCC Requires Amateur Applicants to Read the RF Safety Certification.

The certification statement is: "I have READ and WILL COMPLY with Section 97.13(c) of the Commission's Rules regarding RADIOFREQUENCY (RF) RADIATION SAFETY and the amateur service section of OST/OET Bulletin Number 65."

#### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FOR AMATEUR RADIO OPERATORS

#### FCC Requires Amateur Applicants to Read the RF Safety Certification

The FCC requires all applicants to read the <u>RF Safety Certification</u>. Unfortunately, FCC has not provided this additional information in any of their instructions. As a courtesy, the ARRL VEC has provided the information you will need to read and must comply with.

The certification statement is: "I have READ and WILL COMPLY with Section 97.13(c) of the Commission's Rules regarding RADIOFREQUENCY (RF) RADIATION SAFETY and the amateur service section of OST/OET Bulletin Number 65.

#### FCC Rules and RF Safety Bulletin

FCC Section 97.13(c) reads: Before causing or allowing an amateur station to transmit from any place where the operation of the station could cause human exposure to RF electromagnetic field levels in excess of those allowed under §1.1310 of this chapter, the licensee is required to take certain actions.

1. The licensee must perform the routine RF environmental evaluation prescribed by §1.1307(b) of this chapter, if the power of the licensee's station exceeds the limits given in the following table:

Wavelength Band & Evaluation Required if Power* (watts) Exceeds					
MF/HF	VHF	SHF			
160m - 40m = 500 watts	all bands = 50 watts	all bands = 250 watts			
30m = 425 watts					
20m = 225 watts	UHF	EHF			
17m = 125 watts	70cm = 70 watts	all bands = 250 watts			
15m = 100 watts	33cm = 150 watts				
12m = 75 watts	23cm = 200 watts				
10m = 50 watts	13cm = 250 watts				

- Repeater stations (all bands) non-building-mounted antennas:
- height above ground level to lowest point of antenna < 10 m and power > 500 W ERP
- Building-mounted antennas: power > 500 W ERP
- \* Power = PEP input to antenna except, for repeater stations only, power exclusion is based on ERP (effective radiated power).
  - 2. If the routine environmental evaluation indicates that the RF electromagnetic fields could exceed the limits contained in §1.1310 of this chapter in accessible areas, the licensee must take action to prevent human exposure to such RF electromagnetic fields. Further information on evaluating compliance with these limits can be found in the FCC's OET Bulletin 65, "Evaluating Compliance with FCC-Specified Guidelines for Human Exposure to Radio Frequency Electromagnetic Fields.

#### The Amateur Section of OET Bulletin Number 65:

In the FCC's Report and Order, certain amateur radio installations were made subject to routine evaluation for compliance with the FCC's RF exposure guidelines. Also, amateur licensees will be expected to demonstrate their knowledge of the FCC guidelines through examinations. Applicants for new licenses and renewals also will be required to demonstrate that they have read and that they understand the applicable rules Applicants for new licenses and renewals also will be required to demonstrate that they have read and that they understand the applicable rules regarding RF exposure. Before causing or allowing an amateur station to transmit from any place where the operation of the station could cause human exposure to RF radiation levels in excess of the FCC guidelines amateur licensees are required to take certain actions. A routine RF radiation evaluation is required if the transmitter power of the station exceeds the levels shown and specified in 47 CFR § 97.13(c)(1)<sup>2</sup> (see above). Otherwise the operation is categorically excluded from routine RF radiation evaluation, except as a result of a specific motion or petition as specified in Sections 1.1307(c) and (d) of the FCC's Rules, (see discussion in Section 1 of Bulletin 65 for more information).

The Commission's Report and Order instituted a requirement that operator license examination question pools will include questions concerning RF safety at amateur stations. An additional five questions on RF safety will be required within each of three written examination elements (for Tachpician, General and Extra written exams).

elements (for Technician, General and Extra written exams). When routine evaluation of an amateur station indicates that exposure to RF fields are or could be in excess of the exposure limits specified by the FCC (see Bulletin 65, Appendix A (on reverse side)), the licensee must take action to correct the problem and ensure compliance (see Section 4 of Bulletin 65 on controlling exposure). Such actions could be in the form of modifying patterns of operation, relocating antennas, revising a station's technical parameters such as frequency, power or emission type or combinations of these and other remedies.
