





Amateur Radio "Go Bag"

de Mark (AK3M)

Have you checked or developed your "Go Bag?" The bag I mean differs from the bag you keep in your car trunk for severe weather.

Your **ARES** "**Go Bag**," should contain what you will need for communications should you choose to be deployed for an ARES event.



Remember, we are not first responders. As a result, you will have some time to get ready for an event. You can use that time wisely by grabbing your "Go Bag," and checking it's contents. Don't forget to fill up your gas tank before you arrive at the event.

Basic "Go Bag," supplies could include:

- Charged HT(s)
 DC HT/cell phone charger
- 2. Flashlight(s)3. Spare antenna(s)6. Cell phone7. Note pad
- 4. Pencil/pen(s) 8. Spare battery(ies)

Depending on the event and length of deployment, you may choose to add equipment you think you may need.

There are many sizes, styles and prices for a bag that you can use as a "Go Bag." Your bag should be in a size that is able to be carried easily. You can simply search the internet using words like, "Go Bag," "Amateur radio bag," etc. to find a bag that fits your needs.

Harbor Freight sells tool bags of varying sizes that are inexpensive and you need not pay shipping or wait for one in the mail.

A portable "Jump Start," battery is also great to take to an ARES deployment.

Winter Field Day occurred on January 28th and 29th.

On Saturday Jan 28th W3OI operated at Lehigh Parkway in the field across from the Road Runner's clubhouse. Operators were Doug McNair (N3WGH), Tom Gyory (WW3TRG), Matt Vanderhoff (N3VAN), and Scott Leichssenring (KB3YOT). The weather was beautiful with the sun shining and temperatures in the high 40ites to mid 50ites. We arrived at approximately 13:00 local time and setup 2 HF stations consisting of the following equipment.

Station 1:

ICOM IC-705 with the AH-705 Tuner Home built EFHW antenna resonant on 10m, 15M, 20M, and 40M.

Powerfilm Solar Lightsaver Max with 2 13 watt Powerfilm Solar rollup solar panels. Spiderbeam 10 meter mast.

Station 2:

Yaesu FT-991a

Home built EFHW antenna resonant on 10m - 80m.

LifePO4 battery Sotabeams mast.

We started official operations at about 14:15 local time and ended at about 16:30 local time. Approximately 44 SSB contacts were made.

On Sunday Jan 29th W3OI operated at POTA park K-8855 (PA SGL 157). Operators were Tom Gyory (WW3TRG) and Matt Vanderhoff (N3VAN). One HF station was setup consisting of the following equipment.

Station 1:

Yaesu FT-891

Home built EFHW antenna resonant on 10m - 80m. 23Ah Dakota Lithium LifePO4 battery Sotabeams mast.

Again the weather was very nice with sunny skies and temperatures in the high 40ites to mid 50ites. Approximately 53 contacts were made and they also activated the park.

We hope to do this again next year and would like to see more people attend this great event.

The Board suggest the following clarifications and numbering corrections be made to the constitution & bylaws to remove some ambiguity and clarify the intent of the Board and its makeup

We suggest the following clarifications to the August 11, 2020 version of the LVARC Constitution and Bylaws. These changes do not affect the intent of the document but remove ambiguity regarding the makeup of the board and correct misnumbering of Article III sections in the bylaws.

1. Action: Add the following as item A of Bylaws Article III, Section 1:

"A. The board shall consist of nine members."

(Note: the issue addresses the ambiguity of current section A when there is an immediate past president to occupy a board position for 1 year by clarifying that there always is a 9 member board and the immediate past president displaces a BOG position for that 1 year) then rename existing paragraphs A through D to be paragraphs B through E (Note: this makes the paragraph enumeration proper)

- 2. Action: In Bylaws Article III, renumber the second section 3 and subsequent sections by adding one to their section numbers. (Simple error correction)
- 3. Action: Correct Bylaws Article III, Section 4 Function to refer to "Attachment 1" as opposed to "Attachment A"

This is the first notification of those changes.

PLEASE FIND THE INLINE CORRECTIONS FULLY ILLUSTRATING THE CHANGES AT THE END OF THIS DOCUMENT FOR CLARIFICATION OF THOSE CHANGES AS THEY WOULD OCCUR IN THE CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS
