#### Quadzilla 2025!

(de Don - N3HVL)

On Sunday, July 20, 2025, the Lehigh Valley Amateur Radio Club had the opportunity to provide essential communications, practice and polish our skills, and strut our stuff at the Quadzilla 15k endurance run. This race took place on the rugged terrain within the Trexler Game Preserve, in Schnecksville, PA. It took some quick work by a solid team of LVARC members, and on very short notice, but the team truly performed!

The 2024 Quadzilla event (that's last year's event) was conducted in the same Trexler Game Preserve and there were some serious communications issues. The various water / aid stations and road crossings along the running path could not communicate consistently with event control located at the "Start/ Stop" point in the Lehigh Valley Zoo parking lot. Water bottle supplies along the way ran out, injured / distressed runners were missed, etc. During that 2024 event the North Whitehall Township Emergency Management Coordinator/Fire Marshal (who happens to be N3HVL) suggested that the event organizers add LVARC to their list of resources for 2025, in order to reduce these vulnerabilities and improve overall communications.

Roughly two weeks before the 2025 Quadzilla event was set to take place, event organizers reached out to N3HVL, asking for assistance in getting a ham radio communications team set up. While it was pretty short notice, LVARC delivered superbly. Club President Rodney Wolfe, N3XG, sent out an email to all club members with general information about the event and a request for participants. Eleven hams responded, and we were off and running – towards the solution, not the finish line! Your 11 club members who were literally on the event's path to success were, in alphabetic order by call sign: AC3NN Ruth Lodder, AC3PC Paul Hartley, KC3BLF Mike Mandell, KC3WXH Bill Lodder, KD3BEG Terry Lim, KS3RO Steve Olock, N0VGA Don Hoppes, N3HVL Don Jacobs, N3VAN Matt Vanderhoff, N3WGH Doug McNair, and W3QXI Charlie Eckhart.

W3QXI and N3HVL were working at the week-long North Whitehall Township Junior First Responder Camp when the request from Quadzilla came in.

N3HVL was heading away the following week and had limited ability to help plan for this event. So a MAJOR shout-out is more than warranted for W3QXI and KC3BLF. They jumped in with both feet, traversed the running path via the digital map that Quadzilla organizers provided, found the weak spots, and selected a terrific Net Control Operations location atop a lookout area by the Trexler Environmental Center. Ham radio operators arrived at 0615 hours Sunday, July 20th for their briefing. They were then sent out to their assigned locations, with new hams paired with experienced hams. The ham radio operators' assigned locations were each of Quadzilla's prearranged water / aid stations and each of the fire police controlled road crossings. W3QXI set up his J-pole, dual band radio, and emergency power system up at inspiration point (uh, I mean, the environmental area) and the Schnecksville Fire Chief and N3HVL drove around together on the fire department's 6x6 UTV.

When the first ham radio transmission came across, it was perfectly loud and clear. The fire chief stopped immediately and his head spun around to N3HVL, "How are you guys doing that? We can never talk to each other in this place!" N3HVL replied, "Hey, it's ham radio. It's what we do, baby."


Separately, two runners were reported injured at various points in the event. The runners' locations and situations were relayed by ham radio operators at the aid stations to Net Control. Net Control (W3QXI) then radioed to N3HVL (an EMT) and ensured that the dusty duo of the Fire Chief and N3HVL had their marching orders. The UTV was deployed, the runners stablized and loaded on the UTV, and transported to awaiting ambulances. Additionally, water and other resource restocking requests were issued through the ham radio operators and satisfied uniformly. Ham radio really showed its value throughout the event, and organizers already want LVARC back next year. Is there such a thing as County Parks On The Air? Special Event Opportunity?

It was a great testing and proving scenario, both for individual skills and for the club as a whole. With this Quadzilla event, we found another opportunity to showcase what ham radio can do, and the club really grabbed the brass ring.

It's worth mentioning, too, that the North Whitehall Township Emergency Operations Plan is in the last stages of its latest revision. At the beginning of the current revision phase LVARC and RACES were specifically added by name and function. Amateur radio operators integrate with the Incident Command System (ICS) to provide crucial communication support during exercises and emergencies. Ham radio operators can be assigned specific roles within ICS, like Communications Unit Leader or Radio Operator, and follow ICS protocols for efficient communication management. Emergency operations centers and evacuation centers, and related client / evacuee accountability are key among those locations and functions. Get that ICS / NIMS training, and dust off those ICS 205 and related forms! Here are some good starting points:


